I spoke with Laura Chan and Charlie Morgan with the Redondo Beach Union School District to find out current school district capacity and school development fee for commercial development.

Ms. Chan explained that the District is not overcrowded, but has requested a class size waiver for 2013/2014 and retroactively for 2012/2013 from the California Department of Education for grades 1 through 3 district-wide to allow a pupil to teacher ratio of 33:1, up from 32:1.

Mr. Morgan confirmed the current school development fee for occupied space for industrial development is \$0.47 per square foot.
