## **AES Redondo Beach Power Plant**

My family and I have lived downwind of the Power Plant since I purchased our condominium in May of 1990. My primary concern is that over the years I have noticed emission residue on our patio from the current power plant therefore we are concerned about similar particulate matter that will be emitted from the proposed plant and the continuing impact that it would have to our health. This is a health concern that myself and my neighbors (we live in a nine unit condominium) would like to eliminate.

Another annoyance is the periodic steam release episodes that we have endured over the years which can happen at any time (often in the middle of the night). This noise is extremely loud and can not be muffled by closing windows and has impacted our sleep and our performance at school and work.

Finally eliminating the buzzing power lines that come out of the power plant and run along the 190th street corridor for miles is another safety and aesthetic factor which can be eliminated if the power plant is removed and not replaced. This would be a significant factor in upgrading the appearance of this corridor from from its current blighted look of huge power poles and tangled tangled wires and where trash and dumping continually occurs.
