Careful testing is required, don't underestimate worst case.

Expect unexpected uses of the system.

There are many uses for radios that the FCC allows, some uses can cause undesirable results for your system that others can justify their use of. Your interference problem may be someone's better engineering practice that works when yours does not, or worse makes your obsolete.

If you don't identify sources of undesirable results, your product may contain fatal flaws that can't feasibly be overcome.

See attached video speaking of a system once thought to be available for load control that appears to be fatally flawed because it remains a unused load control part of the smart grid for the user in the video.
