The Sonoma Coast Incentive Project will launch this summer and will offer incentives to help cover the cost of installing new EV chargers at commercial and multifamily properties, local governments and nonprofits in Sonoma and Mendocino counties. Starting on March 31, sites that are ready to start work can start incurring design, engineering and utility service costs. These costs are allowed to be incurred but are incurred at applicant's own risk prior to funds reserved date.
