2022 code should adopt all-electric default for new construction

The current building code effort MUST be based on an all-electric default for new construction— CEC is responsible for implementing California state climate goals, science, and public health. Waiting three more years would not only miss an opportunity to unleash a faster, cheaper way to build housing in the Golden State, it would cost Californians \$1 billion in unnecessary gas infrastructure, and lock them into 3 million tons additional carbon emissions by 2030.

Individual projects can make a case (if they can) for why gas infra-structure is appropriate for a specific project.
