RE: City of Campbell Green Building Standards and the Building Energy Efficiency Standards

On February Mr. Bohan,

Per the request of Commission Staff, the City of Campbell would like to express to you our firm commitment to enforce the 2019 Title 24, Part 6 Building Energy Efficiency Standards of the California Building Code as part of the implementation of our Green Building Requirements. As the Chief Building Official, I will work with my staff to provide training on enforcement of the energy standards and the new requirements for developers to comply with the Green Building Standards. This includes working closely with regional organizations such as BayREN to complete focused trainings on updated energy standards and local codes.

On February 4, 2020 A Council Report was made by Bill Bruckart, Chief Building Official, regarding the amending of Chapter 18 of the Campbell Municipal Code by adopting Ordinance 2260, prohibiting the use of natural gas for warm air heating and water heating in new residential living units. The motion was accepted and voted upon and signed into ordinance on February 24, 2020

Additionally, the Council found that, under the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) and 15308 of the CEQA Guidelines, there is no possibility that the implementation of the ordinance will have a significant negative impact on the environment and is thus exempt from the requirements of CEQA.

The City of Campbell Green Building Standards will ensure that residential and non-residential buildings in the County will consume no more energy than permitted by Title 24, Part 6.
