## **Remote Access Only**

The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host three remote-access hearings led by the CEC's lead commissioner for energy efficiency, Commissioner J. Andrew McAllister. The purpose of these hearings is to receive input on proposed revisions to California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 24, Parts 6 and 1. Other commissioners may attend and participate in this hearing. A quorum of commissioners may participate, but no votes will be taken.

The workshop will be held remotely, consistent with Executive Orders N-25-20 and N-29-20 and the recommendations from the California Department of Public Health to encourage physical distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19. #### **Background**

The CEC proposes to adopt changes to the California Energy Code contained in the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 24, Part 6 (also known as the Energy Code) and associated administrative regulations in Chapter 10 of Part 1, after conducting a rulemaking proceeding focused on considering all public recommendations, comments, and objections regarding this proposed action.

The CEC began the formal rulemaking of the 2022 Energy Code on May 7, 2021, with the publication of the Notice of Proposed Action (NOPA) by the Office of Administrative Law in the California Regulatory Notice Registry. Prior to this publication, the CEC spent the prior two years in pre-rulemaking development of the proposed changes. The Energy Code recommendations are required to be feasible and cost-effective over the life of the measure and are implemented as performance standards with optional prescriptive requirements.
