**NOTICE OF RECEIPT****PETITION FOR POST CERTIFICATION PROJECT CHANGE  
Midway Sunset Cogeneration Project (85-AFC-03C)**

On May 6, 2021, the Midway Sunset Cogeneration Company (project owner) filed a petition for a Post-Certification Amendment (TN 237725) with the California Energy Commission (CEC) for the Midway Sunset Cogeneration Company project (MSCC).

MSCC is a 225-megawatt cogeneration facility that was certified by the CEC on May 14, 1987 and began commercial operation on May 1, 1989. MSCC is located in Fellows, Kern County.

MSCC's exhaust heat from each combustion turbine generator is designed to be routed through each unit's heat recovery steam generator producing steam for use in the adjoining oilfield for thermally enhanced oil recovery.

**SUMMARY OF PROPOSED CHANGES**

The project owner is seeking approval to replace the Unit C combustion system with a Dry Low oxides of nitrogen (NOx) 1+Turndown Enhance (DLN1+TE) combustion system. The upgrade to the DLN1+TE combustion system allows the combustion turbine generators to utilize the bypass stacks (generate electricity without producing steam) while staying within the NOx emission limit.

The CEC previously approved a Post-Certification Amendment (TN 202346) to upgrade Units A and B combustion systems to the DLN1+TE combustion system.

**CEC REVIEW PROCESS**

The purpose of the CEC's review process is to assess the impacts of this proposal on the environment and determine whether the facility, as modified, would remain in compliance with applicable laws, ordinances, regulations, and standards (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 20, § 1769).

After staff has completed its independent review and analysis of this petition, it will publish its assessment for public review and comment. Upon completion of its review, staff will provide written notice of its intent to either process the proposed changes as a Staff Approved Project Change or schedule the petition for consideration by the CEC at a noticed business meeting or hearing.
