Dear Mr. Gates,

This e-mail is to confirm the previous recommendations made on behalf of the Gabrielino Tongva Nation regarding the proposed removal of Units 3 & 4 and the associated demolition and/or construction for this project located at the El Segundo Energy Center. It is the recommendation of this Tribe that a Native American monitoring component be integrated into the proposed project during any subsurface demolition and/or construction activity associated with this project.

Since the proposed project is within the traditional tribal territory of the Gabrielino Tongva Nation it is the recommendation of this Tribe that the Native American monitor be selected from our tribal group. The Native American monitor will be on-site to evaluate and assess any cultural material belonging to the Gabrielino Tongva Nation that may be encountered during demolition and/or construction activity.

It should be clear to the staff of the California Energy Commission that any construction and/or demolition activity involving property within close proximity to coastal areas should be monitored for potential archaeological significant discoveries. Any proposal arising from consultant firms that would attempt to diminish the archaeological importance of cultural resource monitoring should be deemed as grossly inappropriate and considered as an attempt at ethnic cleansing of our tribal history.

I request that I be involved in any further consultation regarding this project. I also request to review any documentation being provided to the CEC that relates to cultural resources. Please feel free to contact me at any time.
