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## **NOTICE OF RECEIPT PETITION FOR POST CERTIFICATION AMENDMENT WILDFLOWER LARKSPUR ENERGY FACILITY (01-EP-01C)**

On September 3, 2021, the Diamond Generating Corporation (DGC) filed a petition for a post-certification amendment (TN 239581) with the California Energy Commission (CEC) for the Wildflower Larkspur Energy Facility (LEF).

The 90-megawatt (MW) simple-cycle, natural gas project was certified by the CEC in April 4, 2001 and began commercial operation in July 16, 2001. The facility is at 9355 Otay Mesa Road in San Diego, San Diego County.

### **SUMMARY OF PROPOSED CHANGES**

The project owner seeks approval for the conversion of existing diesel tanks to water storage units. LEF has not operated using diesel fuel or conducted tests using the fuel for over a decade. The project owner is seeking to repurpose the existing tanks on the project site by removing the diesel fuel from these tanks, cleaning them and using them instead for water storage.

### **CEC REVIEW PROCESS**

The CEC's review process assesses the impacts of this proposal on environmental quality and public health and safety. The review process also evaluates the consistency of the proposed changes with the CEC's Final Decision (as amended) for the LEF and a determination on whether the facility, as modified, would remain in compliance with applicable laws, ordinances, regulations, and standards (Cal. Code Regs., Tit. 20, § 1769).

After staff has completed its independent review and analysis of this petition, the assessment will be published for public review and comment. Upon completion of the public review, staff will provide written notice of its intent to either process the proposed changes as a staff-approved project change or schedule it for consideration by the CEC at a regularly scheduled business meeting.

## **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

This notice of receipt is being mailed to the CEC's facility mailing list of interested agencies, the public, and property owners that requested placement on the mailing list and listserv and to property owners within 1,000 feet of the facility site and 500 feet of the facility linear features (for example, pipeline). The listserv is an automated CEC system by which information about this facility is emailed to parties who have subscribed. Any person may comment or file an objection. The CEC encourages use of its electronic commenting system. Be sure to include the facility name in your comments.
