4	MR. BABULA: Thank you, everybody. This
5	is the Rulemaking to Amend Regulations for
6	Delegation of Geothermal Certification Authority.
7	And my name is Jared Babula and I will be running
8	this presentation. I'm a Senior Attorney here at
9	the Energy Commission.
10	Next slide.
11	So I want to welcome everybody to today's
12	public hearing on the proposed amendments to the
13	Geothermal Delegation Regulations.
14	Before we get started, a few housekeeping
15	items to go over.
16	So all statements today in a hearing
17	recording that we are will be doing will
18	become part of the public record.
19	If you're not speaking, please mute your
20	line so that we don't get any feedback.
21	And comments will be taken at the end of
22	the presentation. So if you're online, you can
23	click to raise your hand in the webinar controls
24	and then the host will call on you. And then
25	after speaking, you can just make sure to mute

1 yourself. If you're on the phone, you can dial 2 star nine to raise your hand and, again, the host 3 will then call on you to speak, and then dial 4 star six to mute and unmute. And be sure to 5 state your name and affiliation before speaking, 6 so that way we can get that into the record and 7 on the recording.

8 So just, right now, I'd just like to ask 9 if there any representatives from any county or a 10 local agency that's either on the Zoom call or on 11 the phone? So if you'd like to just raise your 12 hand and we can call on you, just to introduce 13 yourselves. So, again, any representatives from 14 county or local agencies participating today? 15 It doesn't -- I'm not hearing anything. Okav. Do you see any hands, Ngoc or Liza? 16 17 MS. TRAN: I don't see any hand, Jared --18 COMMISSIONER VACCARO: At this time. 19 MS. TRAN: -- at this time. 20 MR. BABULA: Okay. Well, we'll see if 21 they join later. 22 So I'd like to just turn it over to 23 Commissioner Vaccaro for some opening remarks for 24 this proceeding. 25 Commissioner, go ahead.

COMMISSIONER VACCARO: Thank you so much,
Jared. First of all, I apologize for not being
on camera. I'm having some technical
difficulties this morning.

5 But with that, I would just like to say 6 good morning to everyone who is participating 7 today. I'm Kourtney Vaccaro. I'm the newest 8 Energy Commission Commissioner as of early last 9 month. And I have just a few brief comments. 10 So first of all, I just wanted to state 11 that I'm pleased for the opportunity to be able

12 to listen in to today's hearing and learn from 13 the input that we'll receive. I've been 14 designated as the Lead Commissioner for the work 15 of the Siting, Transmission, and Environmental 16 Protection Division, and have a particular 17 interest in the regulations before us today.

18 I've been following the development of 19 these regulations over the past several months 20 and appreciate the comments received to date. I 21 would really like to acknowledge the outreach and 22 engagement work of CEC staff across several 23 divisions to reach stakeholders of all kinds 24 throughout the state, including reaching out to 25 tribes, to invite diverse perspective and

1 participation in this rulemaking.

2 And I also wanted to acknowledge staff's 3 efforts to make the CEC nimble and efficient in its siting process while maintaining the 4 integrity of those processes and continuing to 5 6 prioritize public process and engagement, environmental review, and public health and 7 8 safetv. 9 So with that, you know, I'll just 10 conclude my remarks. And I look forward to 11 listening and learning today. Thanks so much. 12 MR. BABULA: Great. Thank you. 13 Next slide. 14 So the purpose of this public hearing is 15 to receive comments on the proposed expressed terms, rulemaking documents, or rulemaking 16 17 process. Written comments submitted during the 18 45-day comment period and any oral comments made 19 today will be responded to by CEC staff in the 20 final Statement of Reasons. All comments made 21 today and this recording will become part of the 22 public record, as a remind. 23 Next slide.

24 So here's a list of some key events for 25 this rulemaking so that we can kind of catch up.

1 So the timeline here is the Order 2 Instituting Rulemaking starting this, it started 3 on December 8th. Then February 24th, we 4 published rulemaking documents. The 45-day 5 comment period closed April 11th. And then today 6 is April 14th, the public hearing.

7 We're proposing to take the rulemaking package to the Commission for adoption on May 8 9 11th, so that would be the May 11th business 10 meeting. And then looking to submit to OAL in 11 June. And we're estimating a potential effective 12 date of the regulations August 1st, 2022. So 13 that would be the proposed schedule that we're 14 looking to achieve here.

15 Next slide.

16 So for background, the CEC has exclusive 17 jurisdiction to certify for construction 18 operation of thermal power plants 50 megawatts or 19 larger. And this authority include geothermal 20 facilities.

21 Next slide.

22 So the Warren-Alquist Act provides an 23 opportunity for counties to be delegated 24 authority to certify geothermal power plants. So 25 the regulations at issue today address the

1 process for this delegation. So it's important 2 to remember that the delegation only applies to 3 geothermal power plants within the CEC's 4 jurisdiction. So a power plant, a geothermal 5 power plant before 50 megawatts would be 6 typically already under the jurisdiction of the 7 county.

8 And so here we just lay out some of the 9 elements of the existing regulations. So there 10 would be -- the county would have a geothermal 11 element in its general plan. There would be a 12 requirement for petitions that -- a petition that 13 demonstrates the county has an equivalent 14 certification program.

And then there's a procedure that's currently set forth in our regulations in Title 20 sections 1860 to 1870 which lay out this 18 approval process.

19 To date, no county has petitioned for a20 delegation, so it hasn't occurred yet.

21 Next slide.

So the overall purpose of the amendments we're proposing is to element redundant, obsolete, or excessive administrative process

25 while retaining all the requirements of the

Warren-Alquist Act to ensure robust environmental
review and public participation.

And so the two key sections that had some significant change would be section 1863, which is the contents of the petition. So we included greater tribal engagement to clear all requirements of CEQA.

8 And then removed -- we're proposing to 9 remove some of the hearing details and simply 10 rely on the statutory provisions in the Warren-11 Alquist Act that cite to Government Code section 12 65350 to just address the hearing details.

And then in section 1867, which is the And then in section 1867, which is the CEC's review of the petition, we streamlined that review process. We reduced some of the hearing process that was in the petition and eliminated the need for two hearings.

18 So those are some of the key aspects of 19 the proposed changes.

20 Next slide.

So to ensure engagement, this slide shows how to connect with this rulemaking if you're not already aware. And so we've got the docket is Docket 21-OIR-02, so that's where all the documents related to this rulemaking are posted.

1 And there is a way to subscribe to that docket through the LISTSERV. And so the 2 3 different LISTSERVs that would allow you to get notice of any activity in that docket would be 4 the Citing Division General LISTSERV, Rulemaking 5 6 LISTSERV, and the Geothermal LISTSERV. And 7 there's the webpage, energy.ca.gov/subscriptions. That's where you can find all the LISTSERVs to 8 9 subscribe to.

10 You can also contact the Public Advisor's 11 Office for assistance in participating in this 12 rulemaking.

13 And so now I'd like to start the public comment period and invite folks who are on mute 14 on a telephone or the Zoom to make public 15 16 comments. You'll have three minutes per person. 17 And you can just raise your hand and then you'll 18 be called on. You can unmute yourselves and 19 start your comments.

20 So, again, the information is on the 21 screen. If you're on the telephone, you want to 22 press star nine to raise your hand and then star 23 six to unmute.

24 And with that, I'd like to start. Anyone 25 from the counties or local government, if you'd California Reporting, LLC

like to go first, please, you could raise your 1 2 hand and we will call on you and you can make 3 your comment. Thank you. 4 So I don't see --5 MS. TRAN: Hi, Jared. MR. BABULA: Yeah. I don't see anybody 6 on the -- at least the Zoom participant list who 7 8 would not already be CEC staff. 9 MS. TRAN: Hi Jared. This is Ngoc. We 10 have one hand raised --11 COMMISSIONER VACCARO: With a phone 12 number. MS. TRAN: -- with a phone number --13 14 MR. BABULA: Okay. 15 MS. TRAN: -- 17 -- 1512. 16 MR. BABULA: Yeah, please. 17 MS. TRAN: It's a call. 18 MR. BABULA: Go ahead. 19 MR. THRONSON: Hello. Can you hear me? 20 MR. BABULA: Yes. Thank you. 21 MR. THRONSON: Yes. This is Eric 22 Thronson with Townsend Public Affairs, representing the Imperial County Board of 23 24 Supervisors. They are in strong support of the 25 change to the rulemaking, so the rulemaking

1 change. 2 MR. BABULA: Okay. Thank you for your 3 comment. 4 Any other comments? 5 MS. TRAN: Hi, Jared. We don't have any 6 more hand raising --7 COMMISSIONER VACCARO: At this time. 8 MS. TRAN: -- at this time. 9 MR. BABULA: Okay. No. Yeah, I see. Well, we'll make one more --10 11 MS. TRAN: Hi, Jared. There is one more 12 hand raising --MR. BABULA: Okay. 13 14 MS. TRAN: -- from Scott Nichols. Sorry. 15 MR. NICHOLS: Good morning. This is 16 Scott Nichols with Ormat Technologies. If you'd 17 like me to wait until you have comments from the public comment, I can do that or I could comment 18 19 now. I didn't know if you were going to continue 20 comments or not. 21 MR. BABULA: Oh, okay. Yeah, let's just 22 open it to all comments now. Thank you. All 23 comments. 24 So go ahead. 25 MR. NICHOLS: Okay. Jared, again, this

1 is Scott Nichols. I'm the Regulatory Affairs 2 Manager for Ormat Technologies. We have projects 3 in Sonoma County and Imperial County. I've been traveling to both of those areas, working with 4 county staff and local residents on projects. 5 6 And I guess we are -- I'd just like to 7 say, we are in strong favor and support this 8 designation or delegated authority and just want 9 to thank the California Energy Commission and the 10 State of California for taking a step and 11 allowing this designated authority to take place. 12 Thank you. 13 MR. BABULA: Thanks a lot for your 14 comment. 15 Any other public comments of anybody? 16 COMMISSIONER VACCARO: Jared, no. 17 MS. TRAN: Hi, Jared. I don't see any 18 hand raised at this time. 19 MR. BABULA: Yeah, and neither do I. 20 Let's give just a couple to consider their 21 thoughts. 22 Okay, it doesn't look like -- let me just 23 make one more check. I'm looking at our 24 attendees list. It looks like we had 18 people 25 participate. Okay, this could be pretty short.

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1 One more time, any comments? 2 Okay, seeing none, Commissioner Vaccaro, would you like an opportunity for any closing 3 4 remarks? 5 COMMISSIONER VACCARO: Thanks, Jared. I 6 think the only thing I'd like to do is, you know, 7 thank you for the presentation, again, just acknowledge the work of the staff team across 8 9 divisions in moving this forward, and appreciate 10 those who commented today. 11 I look forward to this process continuing 12 to move forward. 13 MR. BABULA: Okay. Well, with that, I'll 14 take one more shot, any last comments? Okay. 15 I think we're done then, so we can close 16 this hearing, and we look forward to continuing 17 working with everybody as we move through this 18 process. 19 And that, I think we're done. Thanks a 20 lot, everybody. 21 MR. NICHOLS: Thank you. I sure 22 appreciate the opportunity. 23 (The public hearing adjourned at 10:16 a.m.) 24 25
