Reversing the Status Quo

Historically DAC participation rates in energy programs have been low.

Often investments are made based on technical potential of technologies to meet climate and policy goals.

Often missing practical considerations such as community preference, community mistrust and program implementation challenges.



Avoid Participation Barriers

Consider

- Community mistrust
- Lack of program awareness
- Familiarity with new technologies
- Past negative experiences
- Top-down approach
- Project flexibility



Develop DER Alongside Community Residents

- Residents are experts in community needs
- Create opportunities to listen and engage with community
- Establish community support from the start
- Behavior change must be considered
- Human connection is key to success!

DACs are most in need often left behind or left out

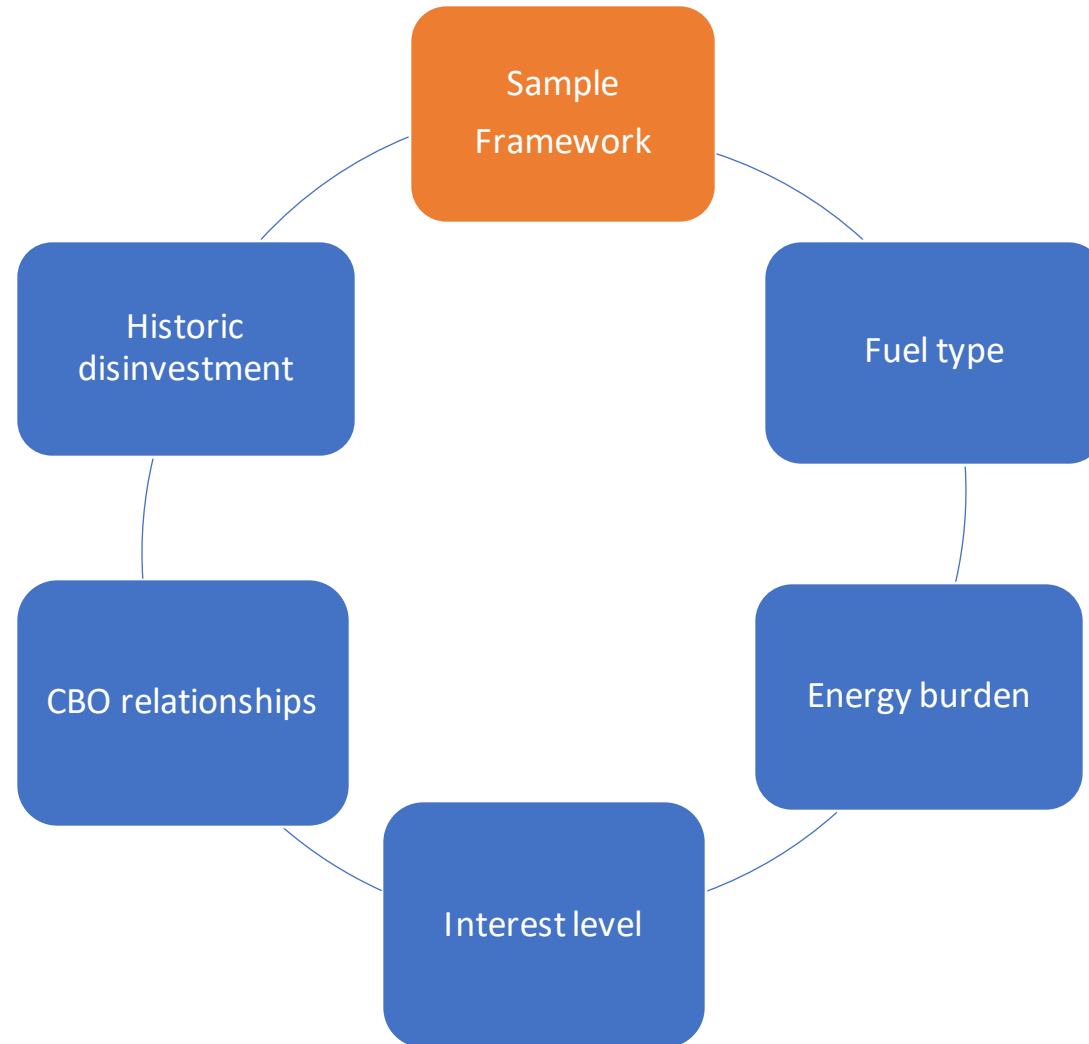
Little to no representation or paid staff to apply for resources

Recommendations



- Fund community-based organizations to support community outreach, engagement and education.
- Partner with CBO's to provide technical assistance and project design
- Funding requirement should include a community partner
- Identify and work with communities from the start of the project
