#### **AVAILABILITY OF PROPOSED DECISION**

On July 29, 2022, the Committee<sup>1</sup> appointed by the California Energy Commission (CEC) to conduct proceedings on the application for a Small Power Plant Exemption (SPPE) for the CA3 Backup Generating Facility (Application)<sup>2</sup> issued its Committee Proposed Decision (Proposed Decision), as required by California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 1945(a). The Proposed Decision was filed with the CEC's Docket Unit and a link to the internet-posted document was e-

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED DECISION**

The Application was submitted to the CEC in April 2021, under Public Resources Code section 25541. The Warren-Alquist State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Act (Warren-Alquist Act)<sup>3</sup> grants the CEC the exclusive jurisdiction to approve or deny applications for the construction and operation of thermal powerplants that have the capacity to generate 50 megawatts (MW) or more of electricity.<sup>4</sup> Section 25541 creates an exemption to this exclusive jurisdiction that is referred to as a Small Power Plant Exemption (SPPE).

To grant an exemption, the CEC must make three distinct findings:

- the proposed powerplant has a generating capacity up to 100 MW;
- no substantial adverse impact on energy resources will result from the construction or operation of the powerplant; and
- no substantial adverse impact on the environment will result from the construction or operation of the powerplant.<sup>5</sup>

In addition, the CEC is required by law to serve as the "lead agency" under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)<sup>6</sup> for SPPE applications.<sup>7</sup> Under CEQA, "project" means the

"whole of an action."<sup>8</sup> Accordingly, we evaluated the entire proposed project, i.e., the Data Center, Backup Generators, and other project features (collectively, the "Project") under CEQA.

To help the Committee review the Project's potential environmental impacts, CEC staff (Staff) prepared a draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) on January 21, 2022. On January 27, 2022, Staff also published an addendum to the draft EIR. The draft EIR and its addendum were circulated to the public and to responsible and trustee agencies for a 45-day public review and comment period that ended on March 9, 2022. After the public review and comment period, CEC staff reviewed and responded to the substantive environmental comments received on the draft EIR. CEC staff then prepared a final EIR that included the comments received during the comment period, the responses to those comments, and changes to the text of the draft EIR following from the responses. Staff also prepared a proposed Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP).

The Committee conducted a public evidentiary hearing on May 27, 2022, to admit evidence, including the final EIR and the MMRP, into the hearing record, to allow for testimony and cross-examination, and to receive public comment. After the evidentiary hearing, CEC staff prepared an update to the final EIR containing additional analysis regarding the Project's potential health risks that was submitted into the hearing record. Based on the hearing record, the Committee prepared a Proposed Decision.

In its Proposed Decision, the Committee recommends that the CEC find: (1) the backup generators will have a generating capacity of more than 50 MW but less than 100 MW; (2) the construction and operation of the Project will not have any substantial adverse impact on energy resources; and (3) the construction and operation of the Project will not have any substantial adverse impact on the environment. The Committee further recommends that the CEC certify the final EIR and updates, adopt the MMRP, and grant the SPPE.

## **II. NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD**

The CEC and the Committee invite interested persons, public agencies, and other entities to submit written comments on the Proposed Decision prior to the CEC hearing where it will be considered for adoption. The CEC requests that comments on the Proposed Decision be received by **5:00 p.m. on Monday, August 8, 2022.**

To ensure that your comments are considered, they must be electronically uploaded to the e-filing system, or received by the Docket Unit via email, or physically delivered via mail on or before that date.
