Dear Mike Hartley:

The California Energy Commission (CEC) has received California State Pipe Trades Council's (CSPTC or applicant) repeated application for confidential designation docketed October 3, 2022 (TN No. 246336), covering the following documents:

- 2022 CSPTC ATCP Update Cover Letter (3 pages)
- 2022 CSPTC ATTCP Application Update - Revised (11)
- 2022 CSPTC MATT Instructor Training Manual - Revised (629)
- 2022 CSPTC MATT Instructor Training Manual - Clean (601), 2022 MATT Recertification Examination - Revised (6)
- 2022 ATT Certification - Additional Questions (2)
- 2022 ATE Training (63)
- 2022 ATE Certification Examination (2)

The applicant states that substantially similar documents were previously designated as confidential on April 15, 2020 (TN No. 232747). The applicant further states under penalty of perjury, that the information contained in these amended documents is substantially similar to the previously submitted information and all facts and circumstances relevant to confidentiality remain unchanged.

California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505(a)(4) provides:

Repeated Applications for Confidential Designation. If an applicant is seeking a confidential designation for information that is substantially similar to information that was previously deemed confidential by the CEC pursuant to section 2508, or for which an application for confidential designation was granted by the executive director pursuant to section 2505 (a)(3)(A), the new application need contain only a certification, executed under penalty of perjury, stating that the information submitted is substantially similar to the previously submitted information and that all the facts and circumstances relevant to confidentiality remain unchanged. An application meeting these criteria will be approved.

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The applications previously submitted by the applicant were granted based on California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505(a)(3)(A). Therefore, the applicant has established the identified records qualify for confidential designation pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505(a)(4).

Executive Director's Determination

For the reasons stated, the confidentiality application is granted. The information subject to this confidentiality designation will be kept confidential until the Acceptance Test Technician Certification Program ends.

Be advised that under California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2506, one may petition to inspect or copy records that the CEC has designated as confidential. A decision on a petition to inspect or copy confidential records is issued by the CEC's chief counsel. Under California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2507, the executive director may disclose records or release records previously designated as confidential in certain circumstances. The procedures for acting on a petition and criteria for disclosing or releasing records previously designated as confidential are set forth in the California Code of Regulations, title 20, sections 2506-2508.
