California Energy Commission (CEC) staff will host a remote-access staff workshop seeking public comment on an upcoming solicitation for research to inform the hydropower relicensing process.

The public can participate in the staff workshop consistent with the instructions for remote attendance via Zoom below. The CEC aims to begin promptly at the start time posted, and the end time is an estimate based on the proposed agenda. The workshop may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

Agenda

CEC staff seek input from researchers, government agencies, investor-owned utilities (IOUs), and other interested participants to inform the scope of an anticipated solicitation, planned for release in the first quarter of 2023. The proposed solicitation will support research efforts addressing the environmental effects of hydropower operations on downstream ecosystems will contribute to implementation of the Electric Program Investment Charge (EPIC) 2021-2025 Investment Plan.

Background

More than 260 hydroelectric power projects are distributed throughout California's major rivers and streams. All non-federal hydropower projects in California are subject to licensing by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). These licenses are for either 30 or 50 years. More than 50 permitted facilities, representing 2,471 MW in aggregate, will begin the relicensing process in the

next 13 years. The FERC relicensing process is a complex procedure generally taking five years or more to complete. Relicensing requires multiple the participation of numerous

Research from the proposed solicitation will provide better information and tools to reduce the environmental effects of hydropower operations while ensuring the adaptive, proactive management of hydropower as part of California's resilient renewable generation portfolio.
