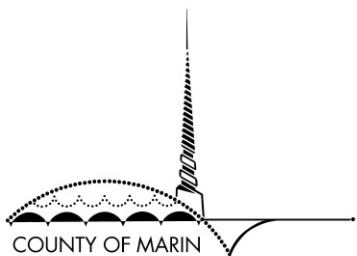

RE: Application for Locally Adopted Energy Standards by the County of Marin in Accordance with the 2022 California energy Code, Title 24, Part 6, of the California Code of Regulations.

Dear Danuta,

In accordance with Public Resources Code Section 25402.1(h)2 and Section 10-106 of the Building Energy Efficiency Standards, this package of materials includes the County of Marin's proposed local ordinance requiring more stringent energy requirements than those set by California's 2022 Building Energy Efficiency Standards Title 24, Part 6. Please find the following materials enclosed:

- **Att. 2:** Staff report to the County Board of Supervisors, outlining the goals of the updated green building standards
- **Att. 3:** Signed Ordinance No., which adopts updates the County's Building Ordinance, including requirements for energy reach standards beyond Title 24, Part 6 baseline for new single family residential. The amended reach standards use a flexible compliance pathway as developed by the California Energy Codes & Standards Team.
