A number of years ago I pointed out to commission staff that I found a Energy Commission Excel file that contained a filming schedule for a film that Disney was planning to make. Staff appeared to not believe this was true.

Search in any of the attached files for the word "film" and you will discover the subject of the film and some scheduling information. The directory name for each file will point you to the type of docket and the transaction number (TN) for the proceeding public record that contains the proprietary information.

How is it that this proprietary information made its way into these Excel files to be further distributed beyond the first file I reported to Energy Commission staff?

How many more security breaches have not been discovered?

Perhaps the subject of the film and the Energy Commission have something in common?
