**Application for Confidential Designation for Data in Integrated Energy
Policy Report
Docket No. 23-IEPR-02**

Dear Pjoy Chua:

The California Energy Commission (CEC) has received Los Angeles Department of Water and Power's (applicant) Application for Confidentiality docketed July 3, 2023, (TN 250931) covering the following data:

- Form 1.6a Hour Load Data for Years 2021 and 2022 and forecasted year 2023.

The applicant states that such data should be designated confidential by the CEC under California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505(a)(4) as a repeated application and that the data should be confidential for five years, consistent with the length of time granted by the CEC in response letter dated May 3, 2017, TN 217439, docket 17-IEPR-03.

California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505(a)(4) provides: Information that has previously received confidential designation under section 2508 or section 2505(a)(3)(A) may receive confidential designation if the application contains a certification, under penalty of perjury, that the information submitted is substantially similar to the information that previously received confidential designation, and that the facts and circumstances of that designation remain unchanged. An application meeting these criteria will be approved.

The applicant has attested under penalty of perjury that the information contained in this application is substantially similar to information previously deemed confidential by the CEC under section 2505(a)(3)(A). Substantially similar information was deemed confidential by the CEC on May, 3 2017, in response letter TN 217439, docket No. 17-IEPR-03.

Therefore, the CEC designates the above-described information as confidential for five years after the data was collected (the equivalent of three years after the data was given to the California Energy Commission). This confidentiality duration is consistent with the period previously granted in TN 217439. Data may be disclosed if aggregated with data from other load-serving entities.

Be advised that under California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2506, one may petition to inspect or copy records that the CEC has designated as confidential. A decision on a petition to inspect or copy records is issued by the CEC's chief counsel. Under California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2507, the executive director may disclose, or release records previously designated as confidential in certain circumstances, and the CEC may hold a hearing to determine the confidentiality of its records on its own motion or on a motion by CEC staff. The procedures and criteria for disclosing or releasing, filing, reviewing, and acting upon such petitions or motions are set forth in California Code of Regulations, title 20, sections 2506-2508.
