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**Application for Confidential Designation:
San Diego Gas & Electric Company Demand Forecast Information
Docket No. 23-IEPR-02**

Dear Sarah Taheri:

The California Energy Commission (CEC) has received San Diego Gas & Electric's (SDG&E/Applicant) application for confidential designation, dated July 3, 2023 (TN 250923) covering the following Integrated Energy Policy Report (IEPR) forms and specific highlighted data on the submitted spreadsheets:

- Form 1.1b Retail Sales of Electricity by Class or Sector (Bundled)
- Form 1.2 Total Energy to Serve Load
- Form 1.3 LSE Coincident Peak Demand by Sector (Bundled Customers)
- Form 1.4 Distribution Area Coincident Peak Demand
- Form 1.5 Peak Demand Weather Scenarios
- Form 1.6a 2021 Recorded LSE Hour Loads for 2021
- Form 1.6a 2022 Recorded LSE Hour Loads for 2022
- Form 1.6a 2023 Recorded LSE Hour Loads for 2023
- Form 2.2 Electricity Rate Forecast

The applicant seeks confidentiality for the highlighted data within IEPR 2023 Demand Forecast Confidential Forms pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505(a)(4) as a repeated application.

California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505(a)(4) provides: "Repeated Applications for Confidential Designation. If an applicant is seeking a confidential designation for information that is substantially similar to information that was previously deemed confidential by the CEC pursuant to section 2508, or for

which an application for confidential designation was granted by the executive director pursuant to 2505(a)(3)(A) of this section, the new application need contain only a certification, executed under penalty of perjury, stating that the information submitted is substantially similar to the previously submitted information and that all the facts and circumstances relevant to confidentiality remain unchanged. An application meeting these criteria will be approved.”

Here, the applicant has attested under penalty of perjury that the information contained in the application is substantially similar to information previously deemed confidential by the CEC under section 2505(a)(3)(A) and that all the facts and circumstances relevant to confidentiality remain unchanged. The previous application was granted September 29, 2021, in response letter TN 247656, docket No. 21-IEPR-03.

Therefore, the CEC designates the highlighted information in the forms listed above as confidential for three years. This confidentiality period is consistent with the period previously granted.

Be advised that under the California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2506, one may petition to inspect or copy records that the CEC has designated as confidential. A decision on a petition to inspect or copy records is issued by the CEC’s chief counsel. Under the California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2507, the executive director may disclose, or release records previously designated as confidential in certain circumstances. The procedures for acting on a petition and criteria for disclosing or releasing records previously designated as confidential are set in the California Code of Regulations, title 20, sections 2506 to 2507.
