On behalf of the Imperial Valley Food Bank, I write to express our enthusiastic support of the Black Rock Geothermal Project proposed in Imperial County, California.

The Imperial Valley Food Bank has been providing food assistance to people in need for over 30 years. We organize food distributions to feed 25,000 people each month, provide Weekend Backpacks to students, and help people apply for CalFresh (SNAP).

By generating geothermal energy 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, the Black Rock Geothermal Project will provide critically needed new, renewable baseload generating capacity to support grid reliability and the State's transition to clean, carbon-free electricity.

The Black Rock Geothermal Project will also provide significant economic benefits to Imperial County. Capital expenditures from the project are estimated to bring \$475 to \$800 million to the local economy, creating over 426 construction jobs and 61 permanent jobs to support maintenance and operation of the facility. In addition to the many jobs that will be created, the project will generate substantial tax revenue and support the local economy through direct purchase of services, supplies, and materials from local and regional companies.

We see a large percentage of Imperial County in need of our services because many people are unemployed or underemployed. We know that quality jobs help people rise out of poverty and feed their families.

For these reasons, we support the Black Rock Geothermal Project. We look forward to the timely consideration and approval of the project by the California Energy Commission.
