Partner with and provide funding for Community-based Organizations Comment on Community Benefits Plan, Section 1: Community and Labor Engagement The DOE guidelines (4.1.4, item 1, p.55) says that: $\hat{a} \in \infty$ States are strongly encouraged to establish partnerships with and provide funding to community-based organizations [and other types of organizations] that represent or work with underserved households to reach and engage with these communities effectively over the life of the program. $\hat{a} \in \bullet$ Several types of organizations are listed as examples, and all deserve support.
