Notice of Availability and Request for Comments on the Draft Senate Bill 423 Emerging Renewable and Firm Zero-Carbon Resources Report

The California Energy Commission (CEC) is releasing the *Draft Senate Bill* (SB) *423 Emerging Renewable and Firm Zero-Carbon Resources Report* in compliance with Senate Bill (SB) 423 (Stern, Chapter 243, Statutes of 2021). Background

SB 423 requires the CEC, in consultation with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), California Independent System Operator, and California Air Resources Board, to submit to the Legislature an assessment report of emerging firm zero-carbon resources that support a clean, reliable, and resilient electrical grid in California.

This report defines and provides a qualitative assessment of various firm zero-carbon resources, including a summary of key barriers, and provides recommendations to address challenges in the adoption and implementation of each. The report utilizes the CPUCs Preferred System Plan and the CEC Reliability Model, analyzing multi-day events across different seasons and assessing the potential need for firm resources.

On November 17, 2023, the CEC held a workshop to present preliminary information on the readiness, cost, and performance attributes of firm zero-carbon technologies as well as preliminary results of reliability modeling assessments. Information from the workshop was incorporated into developing the *Draft Senate Bill 423 Emerging Renewable and Firm Zero-Carbon Resources Report*. The CEC will review and consider comments submitted on the *Draft Senate Bill 423 Emerging Renewable and Firm Zero-Carbon Resources Report*. The final draft is expected to be available by October 2024.
