Public Resources Code § 25402.16

Strategy & Recommendations



"...develop a strategy for using benchmarking data to track and manage the energy usage and emissions of greenhouse gases of covered buildings in order to achieve the state's goals, targets, and standards..."

Building Energy Performance Strategy Report

- ✓ Adopt before July 1, 2026
- ✓ Submit to Legislature before August 1, 2026
- ✓ Recommendations for further legislative action



Required Analysis



Public Resources Code § 25402.16(c)

- 1) Avoid increasing utility and rental costs, including:
 - A) Protect renters during renovations
 - B) Prohibit rent increases caused by required renovations
- 2) Feasibility and cost-effectiveness
- 3) Compliance flexibility
- 4) Equitable access to jobs and other economic opportunities
- 5) Reductions in fuel-related emissions
- 6) Tenant benefits
- 7) Process for alternative compliance
- 8) Process to authorize local jurisdictions to exceed the state strategy



Required Outreach & Consultation



Public Resources Code § 25402.16(d)

- ...the commission shall consider input from... all of the following:
- 1) Under-resourced communities and community-based organizations
- 2) City and county governments
- 3) Affordable housing owners and operators
- 4) Low income and small commercial tenant representatives
- 5) Energy service and equipment providers
- 6) Labor unions
- 7) Technical building design professionals
- 8) Facility operations professionals
- 9) Multiunit residential building owners
- 10) Nonresidential building owners
- 11) Energy utilities

- 12) CARB (State Air Resources Board)
- 13) CPUC (Public Utilities Commission)
- 14) HCD (Department of Housing and Community Development)
