Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 20 Section 1623.1, Silicon Valley Clean Energy Authority ("SVCE") provides a list of load flexibility programs that meet the requirements of the Load Management Standards regulations for providing a list of load flexibility programs as well as the *Compliance Assistance for Submitting Cost-Effective Load Flexibility Programs* guidance document ("Guidance Document") issued by the California Energy Commission ("CEC") on September 6, 2024.<sup>1</sup>

In the Guidance Document, the CEC requested that load serving entities use a linked excel document template to submit specific summary information for either Market Informed Demand Automated Server ("MIDAS") integrated "rate[s] or program[s]".<sup>2</sup> SVCE used the Excel template the CEC provided and submits it as an attachment to this letter.

The data in the Excel template describes SVCE's work to incentivize MIDAS integrated load shifting and load flexibility through both rate and programmatic offerings. SVCE thanks the CEC for the Guidance Document and looks forward to continuing to work with CEC staff on the implementation of the Load Management Standards.
