In accordance with Load Management Standards (LMS), each regulated entity is required to submit a list of cost-effective, LMS-compliant rates and programs to the 23-LMS-01 docket by October 1, 2024. Per LMS regulations, Community choice aggregators (CCAs) shall provide at least one load flexibility program option that is cost-effective for each of their customers. In addition, any rates and signals used by identified programs must be uploaded to MIDAS by CCAs and kept current.

Currently, the only load flexibility program that Clean Energy Alliance (CEA) offers to residential customers is OhmConnect. This energy management program assists customers in lowering their electricity bills by reducing energy usage during peak times when it is most expensive. OhmConnect fosters a community dedicated to smarter energy use, where saving energy directly translates into earning rewards when customers reduce their electricity usage during peak periods.

It is important to note that CEA has recently become subject to the LMS regulations. Consequently, we will submit our completed compliance plan for LMS regulations [20 California Code of Regulations section 1623.1(a)(1)] to our board on April 1, 2025, as per the guidance provided by the California Energy Commission (CEC). CEA will ensure that our current load flexibility program, as well as any additional qualifying programs developed between now and April 1, 2025, are included in this submission.
