Once again a battery storage farm has caught fire and a town has been evacuated. The fire department can't extinguish this fire because of the danger to fire fighters, as well as there isn't a method to extinguish the fire. This time it was Moss Landing CA, the time before this it was Escondido CA, and the time before that it was Otay Mesa, CA. I live about a mile and a half from the proposed site of the battery storage farm in San Juan Capistrano. Typically, I would be downwind from the facility and would have to evacuate when the facility eventually catches fire. Our neighborhood would most likely burn due to the brush fire that will start when the batteries catch fire. How can these facilities be deemed safe? The stream that runs about 150 yards from the proposed site in San Juan Capistrano run into the ocean at Doheny State beach. I strongly oppose the facilities construction. When will this madness stop. Putting these facilities in our neighborhoods is extremely dangerous and irresponsible. I work in the Port of LA, hundreds of these battery pack are coming in from China weekly. These are unsafe high risk cargo that require special handling, and they want to put 75 of them across the street from a school? PLEASE DO NOT allow the construction of this facility! Thank you.
