SCE PSPS outages and lack of timely updates and information

l've been living in the rural San Marcos Pass

community near Santa Barbara for 30 years. During that time l've experienced a number

of extreme weather conditions including multiple fires/evacuation orders. I Completely understand the need for PSPS situations.

My concern however are situations where such decisions are based on a large regional predictive model rather than immediate local conditions. For example last week our community was without power 4/7 days, in 48 hour outages. This was when actual wind conditions were nearly dead calm or very mild. This is not the first this has happened regarding PSPS issued by SCE.

The impact of no power goes beyond access to light, heat/cooking (in some circumstances) - but more importantly access to water, based on wells and pumps. I realize that the tragedies in Los Angeles may have put SCE in a "better safe than sorry― attitude, including lack of timely updates/information, but my fear is that in the future such shutoffs will become more common.
