The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host a pre-rulemaking workshop on the refinery maintenance resupply provisions of Assembly Bill (AB) X2-1 (Stats. 2024, 2nd Ex. Sess. 2023-2024, ch. 1) and Senate Bill (SB) X1-2 (Stats. 2023, 1st Ex. Sess. 2023-2024, ch. 1). The pre-rulemaking workshop will present draft rules and discuss the framework for rules to manage refinery maintenance resupply requirements pursuant to Public Resources Code section 25354.2.

The public can participate in the workshop consistent with the attendance instructions below. The CEC aims to begin promptly at the start times posted and the end times are estimates based on the proposed agenda.

Agenda

This workshop will present draft rules and discuss the framework for potential CEC regulations and guidelines (collectively "rules") to implement refinery resupply planning and reporting requirements as provided for in the Petroleum Industry Information Reporting Act of 1980 (PIIRA), as amended by AB X2-1 and SB X1-2. As relevant to this rulemaking, SB X1-2 increased the data collection and analysis provisions in Public Resources Code section 25354 and authorized the CEC to develop rules to manage necessary refinery maintenance and turnarounds pursuant to Public Resources Code section 25354.2. AB X2-1 further outlined the CEC's authority to manage refinery maintenance and turnaround planning, including the authority to establish reporting and related requirements regarding refinery resupply planning.

Background

AB X2-1, which took effect on January 13, 2025, requires the CEC to consider the effects of refiners' inventory on the price of transportation fuels in California. The bill authorizes the CEC to develop requirements for refiners operating in the state to maintain minimum levels of inventories and to plan for resupply of lost production during planned maintenance or turnarounds. AB X2-1 builds upon SB X1-2, which aims to improve transparency into the petroleum industry and prevent consumer price spikes.

The CEC is responsible for implementing the Petroleum Industry Information Reporting Act of 1980 (PIIRA), which requires certain petroleum industry companies to submit weekly, monthly, and annual data to the CEC. Analysis of data collected under PIIRA is an important part of the CEC's responsibility to create a thorough understanding of the operations of the petroleum industry in California. SB X1-2, which took effect in June 2023, amended PIIRA and added other requirements associated with the CEC's oversight of the petroleum industry. Among other things, SB X1-2 revised and introduced several new petroleum industry reporting requirements, with submittals beginning in July 2023. The new information includes spot market transactions, firm ownership, agreements and contracts, inventory holdings by type, refinery maintenance schedules, notice of marine vessel imports, expanded refinery operator reporting, and new pipeline and port operator reporting. SB X1-2 also authorized the CEC to regulate the timing of refinery maintenance and turnaround.

The CEC continues to engage with the members of the refining industry, labor, community advocates, environmental justice advocates and others to implement both laws. The CEC is taking a comprehensive approach to see what measures may stabilize supply and help to prevent and mitigate gas price volatility. The CEC is committed to ensuring there is a safe, reliable, affordable, and equitable supply of transportation fuels during the transition to a clean energy future.
