RESOLUTION FINDING BUILDING ENERGY EFFICIENCY STANDARDS CONTAINED IN THE CITY OF SAN MATEO ORDINANCE NO. 2025-01 SATISFY STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS UNDER PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE SECTION 25402.1(h)(2)

WHEREAS, The City of San Mateo adopted Ordinance No. 2025-01, which establishes certain locally adopted building energy efficiency standards; and

WHEREAS, Public Resources Code section 25402(a) and (b) establishes that the California Energy Commission (CEC) shall prescribe, by regulation, statewide building energy efficiency and conservation standards; and

WHEREAS, Public Resources Code section 25402.1(h)(2) provides that nothing in Public Resources Code section 25402(a) or (b) shall prohibit the enforcement of city or county building energy efficiency standards if: (1) the city or county files the basis of its determination that the standards are cost-effective with the CEC and (2) the CEC finds that the locally adopted standards will require the diminution of energy consumption levels permitted by the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to Public Resources Code section 25402(a) and (b); and

WHEREAS, California Code of Regulations, Title 24, Part 1, section 10-106 establishes a process for local governmental agencies to submit an application to the CEC for a determination that locally adopted building energy efficiency standards meet the requirements set forth in Public Resources Code section 25402.1(h)(2); and

WHEREAS, The City of San Mateo submitted an application to the CEC that included: (1) the basis of its determination that the locally adopted energy efficiency standards contained in Ordinance No. 2025-01 are cost-effective and (2) documentation that the locally adopted energy efficiency standards contained in Ordinance No. 2025-01 will require the diminution of energy consumption levels compared to the 2022 Building Energy Efficiency Standards (Energy Code), as required by California Code of Regulations, Title 24, Part 1, section 10-106, on January 29, 2025; and

WHEREAS, The City of San Mateo adopted a determination at a public meeting on January 21, 2025, that the locally adopted energy efficiency standards contained in Ordinance No. 2025-01 are cost-effective; and

WHEREAS, CEC staff has analyzed whether the locally adopted energy efficiency standards contained in Ordinance No. 2025-01 will require the diminution of energy

consumption levels compared to the 2022 Energy Code, and determined that it will do so; and

WHEREAS, California Code of Regulations, Title 24, Part 1, section 10-106(b)(4) requires that the local governmental agency's application include any findings, determinations, declarations, or reports, including any negative declaration or environmental impact report, required pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act, Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, The City of San Mateo, in its application to the CEC, submitted the California Environmental Quality Act documentation required by California Code of Regulations, Title 24, Part 1, section 10-106(b)(4); and

WHEREAS, The locally adopted energy efficiency and conservation standards application filed by the City of San Mateo satisfies the requirements of California Code of Regulations, Title 24, Part 1, section 10-106; and

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, pursuant to Public Resources Code section 25402.1(h)(2), the CEC finds the following: (1) The City of San Mateo has filed the basis of its determination that the locally adopted energy efficiency standards contained in Ordinance No. 2025-01 are cost-effective, and (2) Ordinance No. 2025-01 will require the diminution of energy consumption levels compared to the 2022 Energy Code; and

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the CEC directs the Executive Director to take all actions necessary to implement this Resolution.

WHEREAS, County of Imperial is the Lead Agency for the Hell's Kitchen Power & Lithium Project, proposed by Controlled Thermal Resources (US) Inc. via its subsidiaries, to build a geothermal power plant that will produce up to 49.9 megawatts of net geothermal energy and develop mineral extraction and processing facilities capable of producing lithium hydroxide, silica, and polymetallic products. The project will be located in the Salton Sea Known Geothermal Resource Area; and

WHEREAS, The Imperial County Planning and Development Services, prepared an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Hell's Kitchen Project (SCH# 2022030704), Findings of Fact and Statement of Overriding Considerations (FOFSOC), a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP); and Conditional Use Permits (CUP) # 21-0020, for the construction, operation, maintenance, and decommissioning of a geothermal power plan facility, and # 21-0021, for the construction, operation, maintenance, and decommissioning of a mineral extraction and production facility adjacent to a proposed geothermal flash power plant; and

WHEREAS, The Imperial County Board of Supervisors considered and filed the EIR on January 24, 2024, making mitigation measures a condition of approval. The EIR, FOFSOC, MMRP, and CUPs are located at the Imperial County Website. The CEC has provided links to the documents in the backup material; and

WHEREAS, The Energy Commission has reviewed and considered the County's EIR, FOFSOC, MMRP, Resolutions approving the CUPs and the findings contained therein, the filed Notices of Determinations, and the Energy Commission Staff's Findings, which are contained in the Staff Memorandum and CEQA analysis of EPC-24-048, which is included in the backup materials; and

WHEREAS, the Energy Commission is considering the proposed agreement EPC-24-048, High-Efficiency Mineral Recovery System with Reduced Waste Output, a grant to allow Power Environmental Energy Research Institute to design, construct, and demonstrate a pilot scale geothermal brine treatment and metal recovery system, at the Hell's Kitchen Site in the Salton Sea Known Geothermal Resource Area; and

WHEREAS, Prior to acting on the Agreement EPC-24-048, the Energy Commission desires to make certain findings pursuant to the CEQA Guidelines, title 14, sections 15093 and 15096;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

- 1. The Energy Commission has reviewed the information contained in the EIR, FOFSOC, MMRP, and resolutions approving the EIR and CUPs relevant to its approval of EPC-24-048, and has reviewed the CEQA findings contained in the County's EIR, FOFSOC, MMRP, and the CUPs, which are adopted to the extent that they are relevant to the Energy Commission's decision to approve EPC-24-048, and has reviewed the Staff Memorandum identified above.
- The County has already adopted the mitigation measures recommended in the EIR, FOFSOC, MMRP, and the CUPs, and has authority to implement the mitigation measures or to seek any required approvals for the mitigation measures and the Energy Commission has no direct authority to implement the mitigation measures.
- The Energy Commission has reviewed and considered the EIR, FOFSOC, MMRP, Resolutions approving the CUPs, and the Staff memorandum, and finds that these documents are adequate for its use as the decision-making body for its consideration of EPC-24-048.
- Approval of EPC-24-048 is within the scope of Conditional Use Permits 21-0020 and 21-0021 approved by the County, and within the activities evaluated in the EIR and CUPs.
- 5. Because the EIR was finalized and filed on January 24, 2024, and because the CUPs were approved and filed on January 24, 2024, none of the circumstances within CCR, title 14, section 15162 are present and there have been no substantial project changes and no substantial changes in the project circumstances that would require major revisions to the EIR or CUPs, either due to the involvement of new significant environmental effects, or to an increase in the severity of previously identified significant impacts, and there is no new information of substantial importance that would change the conclusions set forth in the EIR.
- 6. The Energy Commission has not identified any feasible alternative of additional feasible mitigation measures within its power that would substantially lessen or avoid any significant effect the Project would have on the environment.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that the Energy Commission finds, on the basis of the entire record before it, that the mitigation measures incorporated in the EIR will prevent EPC-24-048 from having any significant environmental impacts; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that the Energy Commission approves EPC-24-048 with Power Environmental Energy Research Institute for \$4,428,021.

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill (AB) 205 (Ting, Statutes of 2022, Chapter 61), added, among other statutes, Public Resources Code section 25792, which directs the California Energy Commission (CEC) to implement and administer the Demand Side Grid Support (DSGS) program to incentivize dispatchable customer load reduction and backup generation operation as on-call emergency supply and load reduction for the state's electrical grid during extreme events using moneys appropriated therefor; and

WHEREAS, AB 205, as amended by AB 107 (Gabriel, Statutes of 2024, Chapter 22), AB 102 (Ting, Statutes of 2023, Chapter 38), as amended by Senate Bill (SB) 109 (Wiener, Statutes of 2024, Chapter 36), and SB 108 (Wiener, Statutes of 2024, Chapter 35) appropriated an overall program budget of \$127.5 million for the DSGS program to provide incentives and to be used for associated mitigation costs; and

WHEREAS, Public Resources Code section 25792, section 18 of AB 205, section 11 of SB 109, and section 15.14(e) of AB 107 provide that the CEC shall develop and adopt regulations, guidelines, or other standards for the program in consultation with California balancing authorities and the California Air Resource Board (CARB) and that the Administrative Procedure Act (commencing with Government Code section 11340) does not apply to regulations, guidelines, or other standards for the program adopted at a CEC business meeting; and

WHEREAS, the CEC has consulted with, the Public Utilities Commission, California balancing authorities, and CARB in developing these guidelines; and

WHEREAS, Public Resources Code section 25792 directs the CEC to "allocate moneys to develop a new statewide program that provides incentives to reduce customer net load during extreme events with upfront capacity commitments and for per-unit reductions in net load"; and

WHEREAS, section 18 of AB 205 and SB 109 provide that the CEC may "[u]se any type of third- party block grant or contract with incentive program implementers for the purposes of implementing the program"; and

WHEREAS, section 18 of AB 205 and SB 109 provide that "[c]ontracts, grants, or loans entered into with these funds shall not require the review, consent, or approval of the Department of General Services or any other state department or agency and do not

need to comply with requirements under the State Contracting Manual, the Public Contract Code, or the contracting requirements of Article 4 (commencing with Section 19130) of Chapter 5 of Part 2 of Division 5 of Title 2 of the Government Code;" and

WHEREAS, section 18 of AB 205 provides that "[t]hese funds shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the [CEC] until June 30, 2026, and shall be available for liquidation until June 30, 2030;" and

WHEREAS, SB 109 provides that "[t]hese funds shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the [CEC] until June 30, 2027, and shall be available for liquidation until June 30, 2030;" and

WHEREAS, SB 108 provides that "[t]hese funds shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the [CEC] until June 30, 2028, and shall be available for liquidation until June 30, 2032;" and

WHEREAS, the CEC, at its August 10, 2022, business meeting adopted the DSGS Program Guidelines, First Edition; and

WHEREAS, AB 209 (Ting, Statutes of 2022, Chapter 251) amended Public Resources Code section 25792 to expand DSGS program eligibility to include "all energy customers in the state, except those enrolled in demand response or emergency load reduction programs offered by entities under the jurisdiction of the Public Utilities Commission;" and

WHEREAS, Public Resources Code section 25792, as amended by AB 209, provides that the CEC, in consultation with the Public Utilities Commission, may adopt additional participation requirements or limitations; and

WHEREAS, the CEC at its July 26, 2023, business meeting adopted the DSGS Program Guidelines, Second Edition, to expand program eligibility consistent with the requirements of AB 209 and address lessons learned from the initial program implementation; and

WHEREAS, the CEC at its May 8, 2024, business meeting adopted the DSGS Program Guidelines, Third Edition, to address lessons learned from summer 2023 program implementation and grow participation from clean resources; and

WHEREAS, CEC staff propose a Fourth Edition of the DSGS Program Guidelines to address lessons learned from the summer 2024 program implementation and continue growing participation from clean resources; and

WHEREAS, the DSGS Program Guidelines, Fourth Edition, were informed by stakeholder feedback and were published in draft form to the DSGS program docket (22-RENEW-01) and emailed to the email subscription list, Demand Side Grid Support, on October 4, 2024; and

WHEREAS, CEC staff conducted a public workshop on October 18, 2024, to solicit stakeholder feedback on the DSGS Program Guidelines, Fourth Edition, and accepted written comments from October 4, 2024, through October 30, 2024; and

WHEREAS, having considered public comments on the draft of the DSGS Program Guidelines, Fourth Edition, on January 14, 2025, CEC staff published a revised draft of the DSGS Program Guidelines, Fourth Edition, to the DSGS program docket (22-RENEW-01) and to the email subscription list Demand Side Grid Support, and accepted written comments from January 14, 2025, through January 28, 2025; and

WHEREAS, CEC staff published a final set of revisions of the Proposed DSGS Program Guidelines, Fourth Edition, to the DSGS program docket (22-RENEW- 01) and to the email subscription list Demand Side Grid Support, which incorporated additional changes based on stakeholder feedback; and

WHEREAS, the CEC's staff has considered the application of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) to the CEC's adoption of the DSGS Program Guidelines, Third Edition, and concludes that these Guidelines are exempt from CEQA under California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15061(b)(3); and

THEREFORE, THE CALIFORNIA ENERGY COMMISSION FINDS:

With regard to CEQA:

• The CEC has considered the application of CEQA to the proposed guidelines and concluded that these Guidelines are exempt from CEQA under California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15061(b)(3).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the CEC has considered the application of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) to the proposed DSGS Program Guidelines, Fourth Edition, and finds that its adoption is exempt from CEQA requirements pursuant to the "common sense" exemption (CEQA Guidelines, § 15061, subd. (b)(3)) because there is no possibility that the proposed guidelines may have a significant effect on the environment, and nothing in the record suggests otherwise; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that, after considering all comments received, and based on the entire record of this proceeding, the CEC hereby adopts the DSGS Program Guidelines, Fourth Edition, as published on April 8, 2025, and incorporating any changes presented and adopted today along with any non-substantive changes such as correction of typographical errors. ORDER INSTITUTING INFORMATIONAL PROCEEDING

I. Introduction

The California Energy Commission (CEC) is required to adopt the Integrated Energy Policy Report (IEPR) every two years. The IEPR contains an overview of major energy trends and issues facing the state, as well assessments of energy supply and demand, energy reliability, efficiency, and other energy issues affecting the state's economy, public health and safety, and environment. The IEPR requires participation from, and coordination with, public and private stakeholders, including utilities, public agencies, marketers, producers, generators, importers and exporters, and others, many of whom submit information to support the CEC's analytical efforts. Development of the IEPR is a public process, and numerous workshops and other opportunities for public participation are provided throughout the yearlong proceeding. All IEPR events are publicly noticed, and all submissions are received into one of several IEPR dockets maintained for the proceeding, which together serve as the basis for the recommendations in the final IEPR.

II. Assignment of the Committee and Scope

Determining the scope of the *2025 IEPR* begins with review of the applicable statutory provisions, found in Public Resources Code sections 25301 et seq, and specific sections of the Public Utilities Code and Health and Safety Code which direct the CEC to periodically report on certain information and assessments in the IEPR. Chair David Hochschild is the Lead Commissioner for the *2025 IEPR*, and Vice Chair Siva Gunda is the Associate Commissioner.

On January 28, 2025, a draft scoping order was posted recommending the topics to be examined in the 2025 IEPR. Following public comment, on March 20, 2025, the Lead Commissioner issued a final scoping order for the 2025 IEPR. In addition to analyses specifically required by statute, the 2025 IEPR will address three major topics as described in further detail in the attached 2025 IEPR Scoping Order:

- Advancing clean energy deployment
- Electricity and gas forecast
- Load-shift goal update

III. Hearings and Workshops

The first workshop for this proceeding was held on December 10, 2024. Additional hearings will be held and separately noticed. The Commissioners responsible for overseeing the *2025 IEPR* will issue notices at least 10 days in advance of their respective hearings and workshops and will identify at that time when written comments and testimony will be due, as well as the manner of the filing. Any person may make oral comments on the subject of this proceeding at these hearings and workshops. The written public comment periods for this proceeding, and the manner in which they will be required to be filed, will be established by separate notice.

IV. Authority

Pursuant to Public Resources Code section 25210 and California Code of Regulations, Title 20, section 1220(b), informational proceedings allow the CEC to hold hearings and gather and assess information needed to assist it in formulating policies. Instituting an informational proceeding with the adoption of this Order ensures that the assigned Commissioners responsible for overseeing the preparation of the 2025 IEPR can collect the information needed to complete the required analyses and assessments.
