The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host a workshop to discuss the updated impact study of the benefits of day-ahead markets relating to the West-Wide Governance Pathways Initiative (Pathways Initiative). This workshop is part of the *2024 Integrated Energy Policy Report Update (2024 IEPR Update)* proceeding. Chair David Hochschild is serving as lead commissioner for the 2024 IEPR Update with Vice Chair Siva Gunda as associate commissioner.

The CEC aims to begin promptly at the start time posted, and the end time is an estimate based on the proposed agenda. The workshop may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

This will be a remote only meeting with public access online or by phone through Zoom. The public can participate in the workshop consistent with the attendance instructions below.

### **Agenda**

The workshop will include an update on a CEC-commissioned analysis from the Brattle Group (Brattle) assessing the benefits of day-ahead markets as part the Pathways Initiative. Brattle presented its Preliminary Day-Ahead Market Impacts Study at the January 24, 2025, IEPR Workshop. The CEC used feedback from that workshop and directed Brattle to conduct additional analysis. This workshop will provide an overview of the updated Brattle analysis and will

supplement the public record on the benefits of day-ahead markets. There will also be an opportunity for public comment.

## Background

The [Scoping Order for the 2024 Integrated Energy Policy Report Update](https://efiling.energy.ca.gov/GetDocument.aspx?tn=255866&DocumentContentId=91717), available at <https://efiling.energy.ca.gov/GetDocument.aspx?tn=255866&DocumentContentId=91717>, directs the CEC to “identify new energy issues that have arisen during the intervening year” in the IEPR update pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 25302(c).

The current integration landscape before western electricity system leaders looks quite different than just a few years ago. The carbon reduction goals, policy directives, and economics driving the transition to clean energy systems continue to reshape the western resource mix, prospective regional markets and the transmission planning needed to support these changes. Since the December 2, 2022, IEPR Western Electricity System Integration workshop, stakeholders have come together and proposed the West-Wide Governance Pathways Initiative (Pathways Initiative). The Pathways Initiative is an ongoing topic of interest that pertains to evolving regional energy markets.

At the January 24, 2025, workshop, the CEC built a factual record capturing how current stakeholder groups and interested members of the public view regional electric grid cooperation through the Pathways Initiative. Step 2 of the Pathways Initiative forms a new regional organization (RO) that would have governing authority over the Western Energy Imbalance Market (WEIM), as well as the Extended Day-Ahead Market (EDAM). By creating this RO and providing it governing authority over existing and planned markets, the Pathways Initiative would meet the goals around voluntary wholesale markets across the West.

The January 24, 2025, workshop included a presentation from Brattle, and it provided the public an overview of a preliminary study that they had completed on behalf of the CEC. That study documented potential financial benefits to California from different market participation scenarios that could arise out of ongoing western discussions regarding wholesale electricity markets. This workshop will supplement the rich record that the CEC built at January 24, 2025, workshop.
