

This Scheduling Order is based on discussions at the November 15, 1999, Informational Hearing and the proposed schedule submitted by Staff in its November 5, 1999, Issue Identification Report

The following Committee Schedule contains an initial list of events that must occur in order to complete the certification review in twelve months. This schedule only covers the period through the release of the Final Staff Assessment and, thus, differs from Staff's proposed schedule. The balance of the schedule will be determined at the Prehearing Conference. To satisfy the statutory directive that the Commission issue a decision within twelve months from the date an application is deemed complete [see, Pub. Resources Code, sections 25522(a), 25540 6(a)], the Committee intends to present a recommendation to the Commission for consideration in October, 2000

Several deadlines are contingent upon reviews to be conducted by federal, state, and local agencies. The Committee recognizes that the completion of those reviews may necessitate schedule modifications. Since it would be speculative to indicate exact dates for certain submittals, the Committee has established deadlines within 10-day increments early in the month (days 1-10), middle (days 11-20), and late (days 21-31)

The Committee may modify the schedule at any time either upon its own motion or that of a party [Cal Code of Regs, tit 20, section 1709(c)] The schedule requires periodic status reports from the parties to determine whether case development is progressing satisfactorily, and to bring potential schedule delays or other relevant matters to the Committee's attention. If Applicant cannot provide necessary information by the dates set forth in the schedule, the Committee will consider adopting a performance approach that would result in a day-for-day slip in the balance of the schedule.

As shown below, the schedule directs Applicant to provide contracts and/or signed options for emission reduction credits (ERCs), including the proposed mobile ERCs, at least three weeks prior to release of the Final Staff Assessment (FSA). The schedule also directs Applicant to conclude all necessary biological consultations at least three weeks prior to release of the FSA. In addition, the schedule anticipates that SDG&E's Detailed Facilities Study will be filed with Cal-ISO by late March, 2000. The Committee encourages Applicant to provide sufficient review time for the responsible agencies to meet these deadlines.
