Hi Ann –

Please refer to the attached Palen Map

- PKFD = Palen Kit Fox Den
- The legend explains the symbols on the map.
- A DKF observation includes: scat, prints, visual observation of a fox, or a CDFW collared animal that was heard via radio telemetry in that location.
- The green triangles with dots in the center represent the current den sites (both active and inactive locations) of the collared pair. It shows their movements on both the north and south side of the highway.
- PKFD 19 is where both collared foxes as well as their 4 offspring were captured in May 2013. Since that time, all 6 foxes have been located to several den locations. Both collared animals are heard with regularity north of I-10 east of the Corn Springs exit and near PKFD7.
- The CDFW collared foxes use the underpasses: Aztech Ditch, Tarantula Ditch, and Sutro Ditch. They have been heard via telemetry and have also been visually observed on both the north and south side of I-10 in or near these ditches.
- A fox was initially captured in Jan 2013 and recaptured in May 2013 in the dunes (depicted by the red circles). Near these two sites, we discovered a large amount of kit fox sign.
