#### **INTRODUCTION**

Intervenor Colorado River Indian Tribes (CRIT or Tribes) provides this Pre-Hearing Conference Statement regarding the proposed Amendment to the Palen Solar Electric Generating System (Palen or Project), pursuant to the Notice of Prehearing Conference and Evidentiary Hearing and Hearing Orders filed October 7, 2013.

#### Complete Subject Areas

CRIT is preparing to proceed to hearing on the following topics: Cultural Resources (including Native American Environmental Justice), Visual Resources, and Alternatives. However, as outlined in CRIT's Opening Testimony and described more fully below, the analysis necessary for an adequate evaluation of impacts to cultural resources has not yet been completed. CRIT has not evaluated—and therefore provides no opinion—on the readiness of other subject areas for evidentiary hearing.

#### Incomplete Subject Areas

CRIT contends that the evaluation of Project impacts on cultural resources is not yet complete and that this subject area is therefore not yet ready to proceed to evidentiary hearings. In particular, the following analysis remains incomplete, unavailable, or not fully incorporated into CEC staff's analysis: Class II surveys of the areas of direct visual impact, trail studies, prehistoric archaeological record search data, consultation with affected Indian tribes, and ethnographic interviews with CRIT tribal members. These activities must be completed and incorporated into the analysis of the Project before proceeding to evidentiary hearings. In addition, CRIT notes that it has had very little time to review documents associated with cultural resources. The FSA was not released until September 23, 2013. The ethnographic study was not provided until October 15, 2013. These are lengthy, complex documents, and additional time would allow for a more comprehensive response.

#### **Disputed Subject Areas**

At this time, CRIT believes the following areas remain disputed and require adjudication: Cultural Resources (including Native American Environmental Justice), Visual Resources, and Alternatives. CRIT has provided opening and rebuttal testimony outlining the specific details of these disputes. CRIT has not yet had the opportunity to thoroughly review rebuttal testimony filed yesterday. Consequently, CRIT reserves the right to raise additional topics or sub-areas during the Pre-Conference Hearing.

CRIT acknowledges that many of the disputed issues identified by CRIT involve both legal and factual disputes or predominantly legal issues. It does not appear that the Commission anticipates hearing testimony or argument following submission of briefing. Consequently, CRIT respectfully reserves the right to fully address each disputed issue, including those involving legal issues in whole or in part, during the evidentiary hearing.

#### **Witnesses**

CRIT intends to sponsor the following witnesses:

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- Wilene Fisher-Holt, CRIT Museum Director, Director of Cultural Resources, and Tribal Historic Preservation Officer. Ms. Fisher-Holt will testify about the cultural resource impacts of the proposed Project on CRIT and its members. Ms. Fisher-Holt's qualifications are set forth in her Opening Testimony. Ms. Fisher-Holt will present live testimony; her direct testimony will likely require 15 minutes.
- 2) Sara Clark, Attorney at Shute, Mihaly & Weinberger LLP. Ms. Clark will testify about Cultural Resources, including the adequacy of existing cultural resource analyses, proposed mitigation to address buried cultural resources, compliance with federal LORS, consultation efforts, and environmental justice, as well as Visual Resources (compliance with federal LORS), and Alternatives (environmentally superior alternatives). Ms. Clark's qualifications are set forth in her Opening Testimony. Ms. Clark will present live testimony; her direct testimony regarding Cultural Resources will likely require 20 minutes, while her direct testimony regarding Visual Resources and Alternatives will likely require 10 minutes each.

#### Cross Examination

CRIT requests cross examination within the following subject areas:

**Cultural Resources**: CRIT seeks cross examination of Matthew Braun, Thomas Gates and Michael McGuirt (witnesses for CEC staff) and Mary Barger, Fred Nials, and Matthew Stucky (witnesses for BrightSource) regarding the cultural resource analysis performed, the cultural resource analysis deferred, the conclusions reached regarding significance both before and after application of mitigation measures, and the extent of consultation with affected Tribes. Cross examination of each proffered witness is likely to take no more than 10 minutes.

**Visual Resources:** CRIT seeks cross examination of William Kanemoto and Gregg Irvin (witnesses for CEC staff) and Andrea Grenier (witness for BrightSource) regarding the Project's compliance with federal laws, ordinances, regulations and standards. Cross examination of each proffered witness is likely to take no more than 10 minutes.

Alternatives: CRIT seeks cross examination of Jeanine Hinde (witness for CEC staff) and Charles Turlinski (witness for BrightSource) regarding the comparative impacts of the considered alternatives. Cross examination of each proffered witness is likely to take no more than 10 minutes.

#### <u>Override</u>

The FSA identifies two environmentally superior alternatives to the proposed Project. The photovoltaic alternative, in particular, would address some of CRIT's concerns regarding the Project and represents a feasible alternative to the solar power towers. Consequently, CRIT contends that the Commission cannot make the necessary findings under CEQA that there are no feasible alternatives available that would substantially lessen the significant environmental impacts of the Project.

CRIT also urges the Commission to consider that cultural resources are both finite and irreplaceable. CRIT members have resided in the Project area since time immemorial and cannot move their ancestral homeland to another location. Consequently, CRIT contends that the Commission cannot make the necessary finding under CEQA that "specific overriding economic, legal, social, technological, or other benefits of the project outweigh the significant effects," particularly the significant effects on cultural resources.

### Scheduling Matters

CRIT notes that Reply Briefs are due less than one week following submission of opening briefs. CRIT respectfully requests that the Commission provide at least one full week for preparation of reply briefs, so that parties can provide complete and accurate responses to the issues raised in opening briefs.

#### Proposed Modifications to the Conditions of Compliance

CRIT's proposed modifications to the Conditions of Compliance for Cultural Resources are submitted separately as Exhibit 8020.
