On behalf of Los Angeles County Business Federation (BizFed) - representing more than 120 business organizations with nearly 260,000 businesses across our region – we are writing to support the Alamitos Energy Center (AEC) project to help our region meet its critical and growing needs.

By replacing the existing power plant, AEC will provide fast-response, modern, clean, and efficient power that fully supports California's electrical reliability needs. This is especially important given that California's aggressive goals to increase the use of renewable energy to 33% by 2020, reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 80%, and drastically reduce use of ocean water for power generation come at the same time that demand for electrically continues to increase. The new plant will help prevent blackouts and close the energy gap created by the closure of older and less efficient plants and the shutdown of the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, which provided 15-20% of the electricity used by South California homes and business.
