


Palen Solar Electric Generating System - Archaeological Areas, Trails and other Contributing Elements to the Chuckwalla Valley portion of the PRGTL




The PMPD Established:

- •"...the PSEGS facility's two heliostat fields and particularly the two approximately 750 foot-tall solar power towers would introduce stark visual intrusions on the landscape that would profoundly and irreparably degrade the ability...to convey its historical significance..." (TN 201434 Presiding Member's Proposed Decision, pg. 6.3-51)
- •"We are also unaware of any mitigation measures that would reduce the loss of an entire landscape or a significant portion of one to a less than significant level." (TN 201434 Presiding Member's Proposed Decision, pg. 6.3-52), and
- •"CUL-1... reduce(s) the project's direct and cumulative impacts to the greatest extent feasible, but those impacts would not be reduced to a less than significant level." (TN 201434 Presiding Member's Proposed Decision, pg. 6.3-61)

The Committee Further Advised:

•"...there are at least two interests the Committee needs to consider when we look at cultural resource impacts...one is the generalized state interest in... better understanding of the many and varied cultural and historical resources... the other is ...(the) interests and concerns of Native Americans..." (TN 201546, Palen Transcript of the Committee Conference held January 7, 2013, pg.17), and

•"CUL-1 seems too oriented towards the State interests and not as well suited to the Native American concerns that the Committee heard in this proceeding." (TN 201546, Palen Transcript of the Committee Conference held January 7, 2013, pg.18)


