BACKGROUND

On December 1, 2010, the Energy Commission adopted an Order Instituting an Informational Proceeding (Lessons Learned 10-SIT-OII-1) on issues that are critical to the licensing of power plants. Since the initiation of the OII, Commission staff has performed the following key tasks:

- 1) Compared Energy Commission staff assessments with environmental documents from other state and local agencies to understand what differences exist and whether the staff assessment, or the information gathering process to produce the staff assessment, should be revised in anyway.
- Developed more in-depth training of Energy Commission staff involved in the siting process.
- 3) Held two workshops: one to discuss the Commission's siting process with stakeholders to solicit ideas for improvements and a second workshop with county and state agencies to discuss approaches toward project siting.

4) Performed a comprehensive review of the 1000, 1100, 1200, and 1700 sections of the Energy Commission's Title 20 regulations and developed proposed draft language that seeks to address issues raised by staff and stakeholders. The draft language covers not only the Energy Commission's siting work but also addresses Energy Commission-wide process issues.

DRAFT LANGUAGE
