# Background

The CECP was approved by the Energy Commission on May 31, 2012, as a 540megawatt (MW) natural-gas combined-cycle power generator. It would consist of two power blocks, each having one rapid-response combustion turbine generator (CTG), one heat recovery steam generator (HRSG), one condensing steam turbine generator (STG), an air-cooled fin-fan cooler, and associated support equipment.

Two amendment petitions are pending. The first (Petition to Remove Obsolete Facilities to Support Construction of the Carlsbad Energy Center Project, TN 202267), seeks permission to demolish three above-ground storage tanks - tanks 1 and 2 to the west of the rail corridor, and tank 4 to the south of the approved project boundary. Those tanks

would be demolished in addition to tanks 5 - 7 on the approved project site; tanks 5 - 7 were approved for demolition in the 2012 Commission Decision. The second petition (Petition to Amend Carlsbad Energy Center Project, TNs 202287-1, 202287-2, and 202287-3) would change the project to consist of six simple-cycle turbine generators producing approximately 632 MW. The project site would be expanded to include the storage tank (tank 4) area to the south of the presently approved area, adding seven acres to the approved 23 acre facility. A new administration and control building and a warehouse would be added on the site.

The Committee ordered on September 23 that both amendments will be considered and processed together (TN 203092).

### Purpose of the Hearing and Status Conference

The hearing is for the purpose of considering the following pending motions and petitions and any subsequently filed requests that are then ripe for consideration:

Robert Simpson's October 6, 2014 "1712 (b) Objection to Committee Prejudice of Petition of Intervene, etc." (TN 203166);

Robert Sarvey's October 6, 2014 "Petition to Intervene" (TN 203169); and

Power of Vision's October 7, 2014 "Request to Commissioners re Discovery Cutoff" (TN 203174).

In addition to the above requests, the Committee will conduct a status conference to discuss the progress made thus far in the proceeding, any barriers to the timely completion of Staff's analysis, date-specific project milestones, and any other matters relevant to the schedule. We specifically request that a representative of the San Diego Air Pollution Control District be present in person or via WebEx to inform us of the status of the District's preliminary and final determinations of compliance with its rules.

### **ORDERS RE: Responses to the Pending Motions and Petitions**

The parties are ordered to file their written responses to the above motions and petitions **no later than October 21, 2014**.

### **Closed Sessions**

The Committee may, pursuant to Government Code section 11126, temporarily adjourn to a closed session to deliberate on matters before the Committee for decision such as the preparation of its decisions or motions and other matters then pending before the Committee.

### Public Adviser and Public Participation

The Energy Commission invites members of the public and other interested parties to participate either on an informal basis or by intervening in the proceeding. Both types of participation allow written and oral comments. At the informal participation level, written and oral public comments are considered by the Commissioners and are part of the record, but are not part of the formal evidentiary record. Intervenors have the right to introduce evidence into the evidentiary record and cross-examine the other parties' witnesses.


