Background

The Carlsbad Energy Center Project was approved by the Energy Commission on May 31, 2012, as a 540-megawatt (MW) natural-gas combined-cycle power generator. It would consist of two power blocks, each having one rapid-response combustion turbine generator (CTG), one heat recovery steam generator (HRSG), one condensing steam turbine generator (STG), an air-cooled fin-fan cooler, and associated support equipment.

Two amendment petitions are pending. The first (Petition to Remove Obsolete Facilities to Support Construction of the Carlsbad Energy Center Project²), seeks permission to demolish three above-ground storage tanks - tanks 1 and 2 to the west of the rail corridor, and tank 4 to the south of the approved project boundary. Those tanks would be demolished in addition to tanks 5 – 7 on the approved project site; tanks 5 – 7 were approved for demolition in the 2012 Commission Decision. The second petition (Petition to Amend Carlsbad Energy Center Project³) would change the project to consist of six simple-cycle turbine generators producing approximately 632 MW. The project site would be expanded to include the storage tank (tank 4) area to the south of the presently approved area, adding seven acres to the approved 23 acre facility. A new administration and control building and a warehouse would be added on the site.

On August 7, 2014, Mr. Simpson filed a Petition to Intervene⁴ in this proceeding. On September 23, 2014, the Committee issued its order⁵ granting the petition but limiting Mr. Simpson's participation as an intervenor to the topics of air quality, greenhouse gases, and public health. On October 6, 2014, Mr. Simpson filed a document⁶ containing six separately delineated motions, requests, and objections, one of which was an appeal of the Committee's September 23 order to the full Energy Commission.

The purpose of this hearing is to consider at a Business Meeting whether the Energy Commission should approve or modify the September 23 order. Parties and members of the public may participate and offer oral and written comments on the order.
