Thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on the Preliminary Staff Assessment for the above referenced project. The County of San Diego Department of Environmental Health Vector Control Program (VCP) is responsible for the protection of public health through the surveillance and control of mosquitoes that are vectors for human disease including West Nile virus (WNV).

The VCP respectfully requests that the Hazards section of the Final Staff Assessment for this project address potential impacts arising from possible mosquito breeding sources created by the project including but not limited to:

- 1. The design and maintenance of storm water control, conveyance, and detention structures such as impoundment basins, water quality treatment facilities, bio-swales, below-grade drains, outfalls, and underground water clarifiers
- 2. Construction related depressions such as those created by grading activities, remedial excavations, equipment lay-down and construction worker parking areas, and wheel ruts
- 3. The transmission line trench, isolation of the ocean water canal, and remnant basement areas

Any location that is capable of accumulating and holding at least ½ inch of water for more than 96 hours can support mosquito breeding and development.
