Existing and New Title 24 Lighting Controls Codes

My company performs LCATT inspections for hundreds of dollars, not thousands, for ECs every week. My prices are low, I pre inspect the project to correct any issues, work with the EC to correct issues and also perform startup services, and the inspections pass most every time. So there is no barrier from my experience with any of the new Title 24 rules especially with LCATT Inspections. If I had not been there to inspect the jobs, the technology would not be installed correctly or working correctly, or just not installed at all. The CEC needs to keep a very high standard for LCATTs. Only truly qualified applicants should be allowed to perform these inspections.

To the comments on T24 controls price barriers ruining businesses, I just do not see that. My company manufactures lighting controls for Title 24: Dimming, Occupancy, Daylighting, Room Controllers. Keep in mind that I invented, designed, UL Approved, and have the product made right here in California at a price that is very affordable. The price is low enough that I sold my product before 2014 for energy retrofits sales and achieved 1-3 ROI for the complete job. So I would counter the argument that controls have killed the retrofit business. My company has been very successful selling the SMART Dimmer Plus into the market that needs simple affordable controls.
