I strongly oppose the Redondo Beach Energy Project of AES because of the 10 fold increase in pollution including the very dangerous fine particulate matter which gets caught in our lungs and does tremendous damage to our health. The Redondo Beach site, in a dense neighborhood of Redondo and Hermosa Beach, is not the place to site such an industrial project. There are many schools and senior living facilities within a few miles. It has been proven that fine particulate matter causes death to living things, like children. This death is unnecessary because there are alternatives for our energy needs.
