#### Background

In his inaugural address on January 5, 2015, Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. identified three key priorities for reducing greenhouse gas emissions over the next fifteen years. These include increasing electricity from renewable sources to 50 percent, reducing petroleum use in cars and trucks up to 50 percent, and doubling the efficiency of existing buildings and making heating fuels cleaner. Executive Order B-30-15 subsequently

required all state agencies with jurisdictions over sources of greenhouse gas emissions to implement measures that will lower greenhouse gas emissions to 40 percent below 1990 levels by 2030.

The Energy Commission has authority over new building efficiency standards, appliance efficiency standards, and several efficiency incentive programs. In March 2015, the Energy Commission also released the draft *Existing Building Energy Efficiency Action Plan* which includes specific strategies to reduce energy-usage in California's existing buildings and associated greenhouse gas emissions. However, meeting the ambitious 2030 targets for energy savings and greenhouse gas emission reduction will require further coordination across multiple state agencies, as well as coordination between public entities, private entities, and non-governmental organizations.

## Agenda

This workshop will discuss potential strategies for advancing energy efficiency. Topics will include developing targets for California electricity and gas efficiency activities, options for cleaner fuels for heating within buildings, building efficiency standards and existing buildings, cost-effectiveness analyses that reflect energy and climate perspectives, and developing market transformation strategies that will sustain investments in energy efficiency.
