NOTICE OF PUBLIC SITE VISIT, ENVIRONMENTAL SCOPING MEETING AND INFORMATIONAL HEARING

On April 15, 2015 NRG Oxnard Energy Center, LLC (NRG-OEC) submitted an Application for Certification (AFC) to the California Energy Commission seeking permission to construct and operate a 262-megawatt (MW) natural gas-fired power generation facility, the Puente Power Project. The Puente Power Project would be located in the city of Oxnard at 393 North Harbor Blvd., entirely within the footprint of the existing Mandalay Generating Station, an operating power plant.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Energy Commission has designated a Committee of two commissioners to conduct proceedings on the AFC. The Committee has scheduled a Public Site Visit, Environmental Scoping Meeting, and Informational Hearing as described below:

Background

The proposed Puente Power Project (P3 or project) would replace two aging gas-fired steam-generating units (Units 1 and 2) at the existing Mandalay Generating Station (MGS), with a new General Electric (GE) Frame 7HA.01 natural gas-fired, combustion turbine generator (CTG) and associated auxiliaries. Construction laydown and parking areas would be within the existing MGS site. P3 would upgrade and repurpose existing MGS maintenance and warehouse structures, transmission interconnections, and ancillary systems to the extent feasible. No offsite linear developments are currently proposed as part of the project. If P3 is approved and developed, MGS Units 1 and 2 would be retired by the completion of commissioning of P3. However, MGS Units 1 and 2 would not be removed from the site.

Proposed Project Description

The existing MGS facility is in an industrial area that includes oil drilling and processing operations. P3 will tie into the existing Mandalay Switchyard, owned by Southern California Edison (SCE), using one of the breaker positions that would be vacated when MGS Units 1 and 2 are removed from service. SCE also owns the existing 45 MW McGrath Peaker Project, a natural gas-fired power plant, located southeast of the MGS. The McGrath facility was built in 2012. P3 will be sited on approximately 3 acres of the northern portion of the existing 36-acre MGS property at 393 North Harbor Boulevard in Oxnard, Ventura County, California, 93035.

The site is bordered by sand dunes and the Pacific Ocean to the west, McGrath Lake State Park and land owned by SunCal to the north, industrial uses to the north, south, and east, and agricultural uses farther to the east. The closest existing residential neighborhood is the Oxnard Shores Mobile Home Park, approximately 0.75 mile (or approximately 3,900 feet) south from the proposed P3 stack, south of W. 5th Street and west of Harbor Boulevard. The North Shore at Mandalay Bay is a proposed residential

development scheduled to commence construction in 2016. The distance from the proposed P3 stack to the closest North Shore at Mandalay Bay development boundary is approximately 0.47 mile, or approximately 2,460 feet.

MGS Units 1 and 2 were constructed in the 1950s, and have a combined generating capacity of 430 MW. The existing units withdraw ocean water for cooling from the Edison Canal. From 2010 through 2014, MGS extracted between approximately 50,000 and 122,000 acre-feet per year (AFY) of water from the canal.

P3 would use dry cooling technology, eliminating the ocean water once-through cooling system used by MGS units 1 and 2, which must be phased out by 2020 to comply with the facility's Implementation Plan for State Water Resources Control Board Resolution 2010-0020. Total estimated annual water use for P3's process and service water needs is expected to be approximately 16 AFY, most of which would be used for the inlet air evaporative coolers that are used for power augmentation. Estimated annual domestic water use is expected to be the same as for MGS, or approximately 3 AFY. The process water and potable water source is proposed to be the city of Oxnard; the point of connection would be to the existing MGS potable water supply.

Construction of P3 is expected to occur over a 21-month period (from October 2018 through June 2020). Commercial operation of P3 is expected by June 2020.

The generator output from P3 will be stepped-up to 220-kilovolt (kV) transmission voltage from the GE 7HA.01 CTG operating in simple-cycle mode. The power block will provide peaking power and is expected to operate at up to approximately 30 percent capacity factor. Full-load output of the unit under expected operating and ambient (temperature/relative humidity) conditions will range from approximately 241 net megawatts (MW) to a peak of 271 net MW.

Purpose of the Public Site Visit, Environmental Scoping Meeting and Informational Hearing

The power plant certification and licensing process, which incorporates requirements equivalent to the environmental impact report process of the California Environmental Quality Act, considers all relevant engineering and environmental aspects of the proposed project as well as its consistency with applicable laws and development standards. The licensing review provides a public forum allowing the Applicant, Commission staff, governmental agencies, adjacent landowners, and members of the general public to discuss the advantages and disadvantages of the project, and to propose changes, mitigation measures, and alternatives as necessary.

The August 27, 2015 Site Visit, Environmental Scoping Meeting, and Informational Hearing provides an opportunity for members of the community in the project vicinity to obtain information, identify areas of environmental concern to be addressed during the Commission's proceeding, offer comments, and view the project site. The Applicant will explain its plans for developing the project and related facilities. The Energy

Commission staff will explain the licensing process and staff's role in that process. Members of the public may present oral comments at the Environmental Scoping Meeting/Informational Hearing and no advance notice need be provided. Members of the public may also ask Commission staff and the applicant questions about the proposed site and facility.

For more details regarding the proposed power plant and associated facilities, see the AFC (Application for Certification). The AFC submitted to the Energy Commission is the Applicant's in depth description of its proposed project.
