EL SEGUNDO ENERGY CENTER LLC'S SUPPLEMENTAL IDENTIFICATION OF WITNESSES AND EXHIBITS FOR THE NOVEMBER 17, 2015 EVIDENTIARY HEARING

On September 23, 2015, the Committee assigned to this proceeding issued a Notice of Prehearing Conference and Evidentiary Hearing, Scheduling Order and Further Orders ("Notice and Order"). The Notice and Order directed all parties to docket a Prehearing Conference Statement and Exhibit List ("Prehearing Conference Statement") in which each party was to identify witnesses the party intends to sponsor at the Evidentiary Hearing and exhibits the party intends to offer into evidence. Parties were also directed to identify subject areas that remain in dispute and require adjudication at the November 17, 2015 Evidentiary Hearing.

Project Owner docketed its Prehearing Conference Statement on October 19, 2015. One of the areas in dispute identified by Project Owner was Condition of Certification COM-13 which governs incident reporting. Project Owner and Staff have disagreements as to novel terms that Staff seeks to incorporate into the incident-reporting requirement and on whether a one-hour reporting timeframe is appropriate.

In its Prehearing Conference Statement, Project Owner indicated that the scope of disagreement appeared to be minor. Project Owner and Staff expressed an openness to trying to reach agreement on this condition ahead of the Evidentiary Hearing. Staff has scheduled a Workshop on November 12, 2015, so that the parties can try to reach agreement on several of the few remaining areas in dispute (including COM-13).

After further discussions with Staff, Project Owner believes it might not be possible to reach agreement on COM-13 before the Evidentiary Hearing. Project Owner also believes that it may be necessary for an additional witness, Brian Theaker, to sponsor testimony at the Evidentiary Hearing. Brian Theaker is NRG Energy Inc.'s Director for Regulatory Affairs. His testimony would be focused on the dispatchability trigger for incident reporting inserted into the Combined FSA. Mr. Theaker's testimony would be in addition to the previously identified testimony of Scott Seipel on the compliance difficulties associated with the version of COM-13 proposed by Staff in the Combined FSA.

Project Owner also notes that it inadvertently failed to identify its Written Testimony (TN-206334) as an Exhibit in its Prehearing Conference Statement. Project Owner, therefore,

hereby files its Supplemental Identification of Witnesses and Exhibits for the purpose of identifying an additional witness and an additional exhibit ahead of the Evidentiary Hearing.
