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NOTICE OF RECEIPT

PETITION TO CHANGE OPERATIONAL CONTROL OF THE PROCTER & GAMBLE COGENERATION PROJECT (93-AFC-2C)

On January 27, 2016, Sacramento Cogeneration Authority (SCA) filed a petition with the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) requesting approval to transfer the operational control of the Procter & Gamble Cogeneration project, from Carson Energy Group to EthosEnergy Power Plant Services, LLC. The 171-megawatt cogeneration facility was certified by the Energy Commission in November 1994. The project was approved with two combined-cycle units and one simple-cycle unit. The two combined-cycle units began commercial operation in March 1997. The project's simple-cycle peaking gas turbine was added later and began commercial operation in May 2001. The facility is located at 5000 83rd Street in the city of Sacramento.

SCA operates two General Electric (GE) LM6000 SPRINT combined-cycle gas turbines, Units 1 and 2, which produce electricity and steam at the Procter & Gamble Cogeneration facility. The steam is used to power a steam turbine for additional electricity production, as well as to supply the adjacent Procter & Gamble facility with steam for its production needs.

ENERGY COMMISSION REVIEW PROCEDURES

A statement describing the change in ownership, signed under penalty of perjury by a representative of the proposed new operator of the project, was submitted to the Energy Commission staff for review and approval as required by Title 20, California Code of Regulations, section 1769(b). The statement affirms that the new operator agrees to be bound by the requirements of the Energy Commission's Decision for the project and understands the obligations imposed by the Conditions of Certification. Based on the information provided, staff recommends the proposed change in operational control be approved by the Energy Commission at the March 9, 2016, Business Meeting.
