The SPPE process follows a 4.5 month schedule, and in order for a project to meet the SPPE, the proposed thermal power plant must not exceed 100 MW and have no unmitigated adverse impacts on the environment. The SPPE is an exemption from the licensing process and is not a permit or license to build the project. However, the Energy Commission is the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and will prepare an Initial Study and Final Decision. The applicant must then apply for the various appropriate licenses and permits from local, state, and federal agencies. 


