Good afternoon Mr. Renaud,

Thank you for your inquiry. CEJA intends to pursue the issues concerning environmental justice, public health, and the environment, that are within the scope of CEC's permitting and CEQA jurisdiction. The Central Coast Alliance United for a Sustainable Economy (CAUSE), a member organization of CEJA, works with community members who will be affected by the proposed Puente project. As anticipated under state law, CEJA understands the CEC proceeding to be the vehicle for addressing state and local permitting as well as CEQA compliance. While participation in the proceeding will hone the extent of CEJA's engagement with each of these topics, from a legal, CEQA-based perspective we anticipate focusing on

- > PROJECT DESCRIPTION
- > PROJECT ALTERNATIVES
- > FACILITY DESIGN
- > COMPLIANCE AND CLOSURE.

Based on our review thus far, the application for certification raises concern about compliance with CEQA and environmental justice in these areas. Specifically, the AFC, as currently framed by the applicant, does not appear accurately to describe the Puente project. It fails to identify alternatives and fails to mitigate impacts. From the community's perspective, these flaws appear to pervade the following topics:
