Shorenstein benchmarks all its operational buildings, both in California and in 25 markets across our national real estate portfolio. Shorenstein is subject to mandatory benchmarking and public disclosure of energy use and carbon emissions in 11 cities and 2 states and is subject to mandatory water use disclosure in 6 cities. Shorenstein supports well-designed benchmarking legislation as a mechanism for transparency and a catalyst of market-based demand for efficient buildings.

In particular, Shorenstein strongly urges the Commission to prioritize the development of user-friendly automated benchmarking services (ABS) as a critical mechanism for improving data quality, simplifying the benchmarking process for owners, and ensuring high compliance with the state's program.

I would also like to call to your attention that The Urban Land Institute's Sustainable Development Committee, of which I am a member, organized an industry forum on energy benchmarking regulations on March 17 and in partnership with the City of San Francisco, generating important best practice learning for the local real estate community, with valuable lessons for state-level rulemaking.
