Background

The HDPP was certified by the Energy Commission on May 3, 2000. It began commercial operation in April 2003. The HDPP is an 830 Megawatt (MW) natural gas fired, combined-cycle electric generating facility located in the City of Victorville in San Bernardino County.

When originally approved, the HDPP was limited to using State Water Project water for cooling purposes; the use of this water also required HDPP to bank State Water Project water for use in dry years.³ On September 10, 2014, the Energy Commission ordered HDPP to file, by November 1, 2015, a petition to amend certain conditions of certification, such as SOIL&WATER-1, to “drought-proof” the facility by implementing reliable primary and backup water supplies.

HDPP filed the Petition on October 30, 2015.⁴ The Petition proposes a “Loading Sequence” for the sources of water to be blended with recycled water at the facility, in order to operate the facility reliably and maximize the use of recycled water as the primary supply. The other water sources are water directly from the State Water Project, banked State Water Project water, and adjudicated groundwater from the Mojave River Basin. They would be blended in that order of preference.

On May 6, 2016, the Committee issued its Committee Recommended Decision Granting Interim Relief to Drought-Proof the Facility (Recommended Decision).⁵ The Notice of Availability of the Recommended Decision was filed on May 6, 2016, and set consideration of the Recommended Decision by the Energy Commission as a whole on May 17, 2016.⁶ Comments on the Recommended Decision were submitted by Energy Commission staff (Staff)⁷ and Petitioner⁸. In order to provide additional time to consider the comments received, the Committee rescheduled consideration of the Recommended Decision to the June 14, 2016, Energy Commission Business Meeting.

Purpose of the Committee Status Conference

The Committee will conduct the Status Conference to review and discuss the progress made in the case. The Committee will discuss the comments received on the Recommended Decision, as well as the scope and timing of future proceedings in the case. Any then-pending motions, petitions, and other requests that are ripe for consideration may also be considered.
