California Senator Monning's SB 968 was passed 7-0 by the Fiscal Committee of the California Senate on 27 May 2016. The current bill text and updated status information is attached. I believe that SB 968 is significant as it mandates that the substantial economic and environmental harms of closing down Diablo Canyon Power Plant (DCPP) be acknowledged and publicized well in advance of the 2024 and 2025 NRC license renewal deadlines for the two units. The problems caused the abrupt closure of SONGS in January, 2012 are acknowledged in the SB 968 bill text. I hope that SB 968 provides strong motivation to the governmental oversight and regulatory bodies - and to PG&E - to endorse DCPP NRC license renewal.

Furthermore, I believe that the cost of the proposed study is negligible in the context of the current California state budget. (The total 2015-2016 California State expenditures are projected to be \$115.369 billion.)

An act to add Section 712.5 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to electricity.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 968, as amended, Monning. Diablo Canyon Units 1 and 2 powerplant.

Under existing law, the Public Utilities Commission has regulatory authority over public utilities, including electrical corporations. The Diablo Canyon nuclear powerplant, composed of reactor Units 1 and 2, is operated by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company in the County of San Luis Obispo. Existing law requires the commission to convene, or continue, until August 26, 2025, an independent peer review panel to conduct an independent review of enhanced seismic studies and surveys of the Diablo Canyon Units 1 and 2 powerplant, including the surrounding areas of the facility and areas of nuclear waste storage.

This bill would direct the commission to require the Pacific Gas and Electric Company to submit an assessment, no later than July 1, 2018, conducted by an independent 3rd party, selected as specified, of the adverse *and beneficial* economic-impact impacts, and net economic effects, that could occur, and of potential ways for the state and local jurisdictions to mitigate that the adverse economic impact, if the Diablo Canyon Units 1 and 2 powerplant were to temporarily or permanently

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shut down before the powerplant's current operating licenses expire or if the Pacific Gas and Electric Company were to decide not to pursue license renewal. The bill would require the commission to consider any further assessments or reviews needed that could assist local efforts to prepare for a closure of the Diablo Canyon Units 1 and 2 powerplant.

This bill would make legislative findings and declarations as to the necessity of a special statute for the Pacific Gas and Electric Company.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 712.5 is added to the Public Utilities 2 Code, to read:

3 712.5. (a) (1) The commission shall require the Pacific Gas

10 (c) (1) The commission shall require the Pacific Gas and 11 Electric Company to issue a request for proposal for the 12 independent third party that will ensure that the selected party is 13 able to make an independent review and analysis of the data 14 described in subdivision (b). The commission shall make the final 15 selection of the independent third party from the list of qualified 16 bidders.

(2) The independent third party shall consult with the Board of
Supervisors of the County of San Luis Obispo, the governing board
